

From the General Manager

If you have not already received a survey from the Association, it should be arriving shortly in the mail. This survey is designed to solicit your input regarding the performance of the Association. You have two options for responding. 1) You may fill out the paper copy you have received in the mail and return it to the office personally or by mail or 2) you may go online to www.scsbca.com and follow the link set up for online survey participation. In order to assure that responses are confidential and that we don't get duplicate copies, each mailed survey has a random "PIN" number in the upper right hand corner that must be used when you participate on-line. Once the surveys have been received, we will publish the results online and in *The View*. Thank you in advance for helping us to improve your Association.

As I talk to residents in our community I am often asked the question – "Who do you work for?" It has been several years since I addressed this question and we have many new owners since that time and have had changes in the governance of the Association with the transition to a homeowner controlled Board of Directors, so I thought this would be a good time to re-visit the subject. I work for the Board of Directors of Sun City Shadow Hills Community Association, however, there is a little more to it than that. The Board of Directors hired Professional Community Management of California, Inc. (PCM) as the management company to provide management services to the Community Association. This is a common practice for associations since management companies can provide managerial, financial, and personnel services to associations at a fraction of what it would cost an association to provide these services directly. All Sun City Shadow Hills Community Association staff are employees of PCM and were hired to work exclusively for your community. Staff are the front-line contact source for the day to day operations of your Association

and are the ones tasked to implement the policies set by your Board of Directors. We look forward to working with residents on everything from planning your next event to discussing your concerns about what is happening in the community.

Inevitably, from time to time, community rules are broken. One of the duties that staff performs is assuring that when the rules are broken that a procedure called due process is followed. Simply stated this means that the Association will notify the homeowner of an alleged violation before any action is taken. A letter is sent describing the alleged violation and the owner is asked to voluntarily correct the problem by a specified date. The letter will also explain any action the Association may take if the violation is not corrected. If a violation is not corrected in the allotted time, the owner will be asked to attend a hearing before the Board of Directors. The Association understands that there may be extenuating circumstances and the hearing will provide an opportunity for owners and the Board to discuss the rule violation. After the Board has had a chance to discuss the violation with the homeowner, the members of the Board will discuss the situation among themselves and come to a decision as to further action. Compliance is the primary goal of the Board. Compliance benefits everyone in the community and helps to make our community a wonderful place to live and play.

If you have any questions please feel free to contact the Association staff. We will be glad to help you or direct your questions to the proper staff member so that your questions are answered in a timely manner. The Association office staff is looking forward to assisting you.

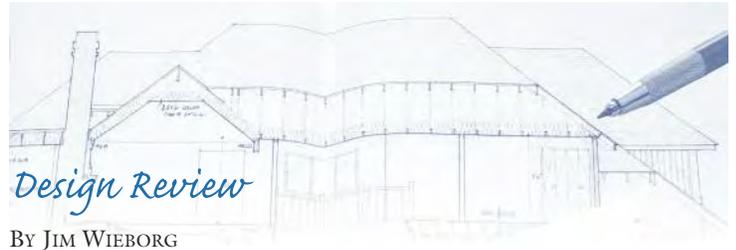
Joseph Colorossi

Committee Reports

Coolers

Many homeowners are installing evaporative coolers in their garages this summer. If you have a refrigerator or freezer in your garage, a cooler would make them operate much more efficiently. If you wish to install one, submit an improvement application showing what you are going to do to the Design Review Committee for approval. The bottom of the cooler must be at least six inches above the ground, and the top of the cooler can't be more than 60 inches above the ground. The only other requirement is that you have at least one shrub or plant one (five gallon) in front of the cooler to screen it from the street.

Homeowners need to trim when their trees or shrubs start getting overgrown. The HOA has had numerous complaints from homeowners about neighbors' trees hanging in their yards, so be sure that your tree isn't invading your neighbor's yard. Trim it if you need to! Always remove broken and dead limbs first, then assess what else needs to be done. Remove suckers from the trunk and branches, and then trim back branches that are getting too long. Remember to NEVER remove more than 20 percent of a tree's foliage at any time of the year. Keeping the trimming to a minimum in the summer is important.

When you irrigate, run your system for 10 minutes three times a day instead of once for 30 minutes. This will allow the water to soak into the ground instead of running into the gutter.

What's New on the Web?




How lucky could we be? Jerry is a past president of the Community Association Institute of California, a

The Baboon Who Came to Breakfast

It was June in Botswana, the dry season. The eight guests for breakfast at the Chobe Chilwero lodge were seated in groups of two and four around the verandah. The lodge had an open floor plan so that guests could appreciate the magnificent surroundings. We savored the last of the aromatic coffee, soaked up the sun after a chilly early-morning game drive, and compared stories of animal sightings.

This was our third African safari. In the last ten years, we had been to Kenya and South Africa. Botswana, more remote and with fewer accommodations, is not for the novice. We traveled by four-person bush planes, flat-bottom boats, dugout canoes, and range rovers. Chobe Chilwero only had five guest cottages, each for two people. Our daughter and son-in-law joined us on this trip, and we were the only Americans in a group of eight.

The camp, located five minutes from the town of Kasane, is in the Kasane Forest Reserve adjoining Chobe National Park. This camp is one of four Sanctuary Retreats in Botswana specializing in outstanding game viewing, impeccable service,


and fine dining. Based on the environmental principle that humans are the intruders, it is essential to keep our impact minimal.

With no man-made barriers between the town, the forest, and the park, the forest acts as a natural boundary. It is unique to Botswana compared to the rest of Africa where human and animal activities are usually well separated by space and fences.

Out of nowhere, he ran up the path from the guest cabins, scattering all the mongooses and jumping over fallen trees, crushing leaves and twigs in his way. The birds squawked and the mongooses shrieked. He vaulted onto the verandah and headed straight for the breakfast buffet at the back of room, a large grey streak that left all of us momentarily speechless.

“Holy s**t, there’s a baboon at the buffet!” I yelled. He looked around once and tried to grab a fistful of rolls. A woman screamed. A man knocked over his chair as he jumped up from his table to take a photo. Quickly, the waiters shooed away the baboon as they snapped towels and made loud hooting noises. Startled, the hairy visitor dropped the rolls, looked around once, and raced back through the crowd. He tumbled off the verandah and high-tailed it down the path just as fast as he had arrived.

Our visitor was a chacma baboon, the most common in Botswana. The male of the species, light grey to dark brown in color, grows up to 100 pounds and 4 feet tall. Clearly, this is not a creature to be trifled with. An average troop is 45 – 50 animals although there can be as many as 100. In *The Kingdon Field Guide to African Mammals*, the “must-have” accessory for foreigners travelling on safari, Jonathan Kingdon

described the chacma baboon as an “opportunistic omnivore.” Evidently, breakfast at Chobe Chilwero lodge was an event not to be missed.

Soon after our breakfast guest left, everyone settled down. The air filled again with sounds of silverware on china and dishes rattling on their way to the kitchen. Pleasant, soft-soled waiters replenished the buffet table. Chairs pushed away from the tables to allow a better view of the floodplains before us. Conversation picked up, and guests told stories of other exciting animal encounters on other safaris.

The Chobe River, a tributary of the Zambezi River, is the only source of water for the large mammal population and home to a large number of Nile hippos and crocodiles. During the dry season, animals travel great distances to reach the floodplains, which host some of the largest herds of elephant and puku antelope, the latter found only in Botswana. Bird aficionados were delighted with the many varieties of soaring eagles, colorful francolins, chatty hornbills, and

graceful kingfishers. In the areas surrounding the floodplains, we saw eland, kudus, large roan antelope, and magnificent solitary sables. Twice we were lucky to have sightings of a pack of six African wild dogs, very rare and seriously endangered.


In the midst of our civilized morning in the bush, I saw him again. He walked straight through the front entrance of the

lodge just to the right of the dining area. He came in as if he belonged there, ready to register as a guest at the reception desk. I couldn't believe it. He stood there, swiveled his big head from side to side, and sniffed the air. I yelled, "There he is again; in the LOBBY!" Just then, our baboon ran to the buffet, grabbed two loaves of bread, threw down the napkins they

were wrapped in, tucked them under his arm and skipped out the way he had come, right through the front door.

I tell you, a Frenchman wearing a jaunty beret and silk cravat, visiting his local *boulangerie* on a fine summer morning, couldn't have done it better.

Book Review

The Brief Wondrous Life of Oscar Wao by Junot Diaz

This book will knock your socks off. OK, it's summer. Make that sandals.

A *New York Times* bestseller and winner of the Pulitzer Prize (among many other awards), *The Brief Wondrous Life of Oscar Wao* by Junot Diaz is one of the most original and memorable novels I've ever come across. It's almost impossible to categorize because nothing else is quite like it.

In Oscar, the title character, Diaz has created an individual as poignant as Holden Caulfield and Randall McMurphy. The obese, sci-fi and fantasy-obsessed nerd-hero is always in love and forever dreaming, waiting, hoping for his first kiss.

His few friends are embarrassed by him, girls want nothing to do with him, and everywhere he goes Oscar finds only derision and hostility. Nor is he alone: his mother, a former beauty, has been ravaged by illness, disastrous love affairs, and worry for her two children; and his sister Lola,

another jaw-dropping beauty, has been cursed with a nomadic soul and her mother's poor taste in men.

The family has moved from the Dominican Republic to New Jersey, perhaps in the hope of escaping the multi-generational *Fuku* curse that has doomed them to prison, torture, tragedy, and ill-starred love. Despite it ultimately being a tale of heartbreak and loss, it's told in such an exuberant, madcap, high-energy, playful, and hilarious way that it's a surprisingly enjoyable romp through the multi-cultural world in which the story takes place. A real tour de force.


Having only the barest understanding of the history of the Dominican Republic, I was fascinated to learn more about the bloody, horrific 30-year reign of President Rafael Leónidas Trujillo and what the country suffered at his hands and those of his henchmen. I was also intrigued by the cultural differences in how Dominican men and women view one another, and what is valued in a relationship and what is not.

In a mind-expanding roller-coaster of a ride, Diaz moves easily between English, Spanish, and Dominican slang, but surprisingly I wasn't lost even though there is no attempt to translate foreign phrases. His wordplay is amazingly fresh and therein lies much of the enjoyment. It's at once poetic, rude, funny, jarring, hip, erudite, and sometimes in-your-face. I missed the references to sci-fi and fantasy games, but it didn't diminish my enjoyment of the book.

In the end, Diaz makes the case that an individual cannot be known or understood in isolation from the history of his family and his nation. It's a most unusual book, and Junot Diaz has established himself as a distinctive and original author.

CFO + Musician = \$winging Music

Can a bean-counting Chief Financial Officer peacefully co-exist in the same body as a swinging musician? Can two vastly different personalities get along? You're about to find out.

Trying to do a little matchmaking, my friend Kristin first introduced me to Norm Bolduc 18 years ago. She boasted he was a CFO for a company just north of Los Angeles. A CFO sounded way too conservative and stodgy to be interesting to someone like me with an art background. I assumed he had to be stuffy,

opinionated, and used to having his word considered gold...not exactly a fun-time guy.

The first time the three of us went out, it was for sushi. Kristin and I could tell Norm probably hadn't tried sushi before, but he was a good sport. Actually, he liked the California Roll a lot, and we got him to eat tuna and salmon sushi. Score one for Norm.

As I got to know him better over the next few months, I began to discover a very different side of Norm. He'd moved to California from his native Massachusetts to

help an electronics company resize and restructure. He really was a true financial wizard and a restructuring guru. But in sharp contrast to his financial background, he also loved music. He was also very warm and outgoing. I watched as he came into a room and started talking to people immediately. Norm never saw strangers in a room, just new people to meet.

It turned out he didn't just love music; he played a mean guitar. I laugh recalling the story of how, when he was 12, his mother bought him his first electric guitar, thinking all they needed to do was plug it into an electrical outlet. After complaining to the music store, they discovered they needed an amplifier to make it work! As a young teenager, he learned guitar right way, surpassing many other older students. At the age of 16 he was playing in a well-established local band.

Throughout his musical career, Norm played in several popular R & B bands in the New England area. First it was the Belltones, then Junior and the Mondos, then The Gaylords, and finally Jonny G and the Uniques. He successfully put himself through college by teaching guitar and playing gigs at night, while studying backstage between sets. Several times when he played with the Uniques, they opened for a band led by a skinny guy with big lips, Steven Tyler and Aerosmith. Norm continued to play until he was almost 42.

In the 80s, he worked in the business world full-time during the week and played with the band some nights and on weekends. Sadly, after 15 years with his last band, the Uniques, he finally quit to finish raising his family. His business career had progressed from CPA firms to large manufacturers, to retail and chain stores, and eventually to business consulting. His friendly "we can make it work attitude"



made him a favorite with company presidents who could always count on him to find a creative solution to their business challenges.

As time went by, Norm longed to play again, especially R & B and jazz, but he didn't have a band. When I met Norm in 1994 he still had his two original guitars, a Gibson Birdland and a


Gibson Les Paul, but he hadn't played them much in years. Little by little, he began picking at a few tunes, mostly during the holidays.

It wasn't until he moved to Sun City Shadow Hills 18 months ago that he got back into playing in a big way. Shortly after the move, he bought a ukulele and joined the Ukulele Strummers. Then, somehow, three more guitars followed him home.

In the fall of 2011, Norm purchased a JamMan Solo music recorder as well as a drum machine to add rhythm and background sounds while he played and recorded guitar. Recently, he bought a bass guitar and taught himself to play it to add to the overall sound. He's not quite ready to go back on the road but, on most afternoons, swinging blues, jazz, soft rock, and golden oldies echo throughout our house and patio.

So yes, Norm has proven that a CFO and a swinging musician can peacefully coexist in one warm, musical, bean-counting person!

Senior Rockettes Rock

Women have been singing and dancing in shows for a very long time. It all began in 1869 when the Folies Bergère was established in Paris, France. Some may remember one of the stars of that show, Josephine Baker, an exotic African-American expatriate singer, dancer, and entertainer. Then in 1925 the Rockettes were formed in St. Louis, Missouri, before taking up permanent residence in New York City's famous Radio City Music Hall in 1932. Finally, in 1991 the Fabulous Palm Springs Follies kicked off with the first precision chorus line dance troupe of women over 55 years old.

And now, introducing our very own dance troupe, drum roll, please...the

Senior Rockettes. This journey began one day in December 2010, when 60 inquisitive and aspiring women from Sun City Palm Desert (SCPD) and Sun City Shadow Hills (SCSH) attended a dance audition with high hopes to become part of a troupe of senior hoofers. The lone requirement was that the women be at least 55. Prior dance knowledge or experience was helpful but not required. By the end of the exhausting day, director and professional choreographer Kelly Miller had selected 29 women. Kelly explained that their goal was to provide fundraising support to the non-profit Kids Helping Kids program, which raises much needed funds for pre-selected Coachella Valley schools.

Following the success of the initial year's performances, tryouts were

held again in December 2011; and 50 women signed up to be a part of a second troupe. But when it came time to audition, only 25 women showed up. Kelly was still overwhelmed by the enthusiasm and eagerness, and she eventually selected 16 women for the new troupe. Currently there are three SCSH women in the original ("veteran") group and six SCSH women on the second ("rookie") troupe. The veterans are Linda Delaney, Nancy Horn, and Sandy Stanton. The rookie line-up consists of Martha Horner, Eroca Kay, Olympia Pilafidis, Linda Sage, Lenore Long, and Linda Aasen.

The women initially practiced twice a week but moved to three and four times a week as scheduled performances neared. Just like on *The Voice* and

American Idol, the judge (Kelly) had the dubious task of paring the rookie group down to the final 14 performers. This part of the process was demanding as all of the women poured their energy, soul, and dedication into the intricate dance routines. But the cream always rises to the top as Kelly methodically hand-selected her 14 best dancers (which became 13 as one dropped out).

The women – dressed in traditional dance outfits of black tops for the rookies and pink tops for the veterans, dark slacks, socks, stockings, and dance shoes – also wore distinctive name tags (instead of impersonal numbers). They rehearsed for long hours week after week to nail down their routines with precision, teamwork, and smiling faces. Dancing in formation with intricate hand and body movements, syncopated leg kicks and steps, and complicated choreography is challenging even for a chorus line of professionals. At the end of some practices the women felt like their bodies could no longer take the tortuous demands. But most persevered, ignored the pain, and continued to dance, although a few dropped out because of the physical demands and intense time commitments.

For all of the women Ibuprofen, Aspirin, Bufferin, and soaking in a hot tub became their relief of choice. Ever the perfectionist, Kelly drove them like a Marine drill sergeant with comforting words of encouragement like “some of you, and you know who you are, could use a little help” and “that was the best yet, but it still could be a little better.” When the women got home from practice, they could still hear Kelly’s ringing voice in their minds: “side, together, side, step, kickball change, turn, tap, turn, tap, kick, kick, kick.”

I attended a practice and asked the dancers why they were doing this:

Lenore – “It’s just an incredible and great opportunity to work with Kelly.”

Martha – “This is so much fun.”

Olympia – “Broadway and jazz were wonderful ways of expanding my dancing experience and I enjoyed the camaraderie of a bright group of ladies. The friendships that developed were the biggest benefit of all.”

Linda A. – “It’s fun, I enjoy it, and I am proud to be a part of the team.”

Eroca – “I like the team camaraderie, meeting new friends, and I just love to dance.”

Linda S. – “When my husband died in September

I was coping with being alone, especially in the evening and weekends. Our practices were usually in the evening and the camaraderie was very helpful, as well as great exercise!”

Linda D. – “I’ve never performed before, so this is new and exciting for me.”

Sandy – “I love doing creative things and our director, Kelly, is very creative with dance routines and teaching methods. I also love the camaraderie of the group and the challenge of getting it to come together in a performance we can all be proud of.”

Nancy – “It just sounded like a fun thing to do. I guess if it’s in your blood and you love to do it, you just keep doing it. It’s great exercise but, more important, it’s just great fun!”

Before their first scheduled performance in April, costumes were selected, ordered, and tailored. When I went to see the Senior Rockettes perform at SCPD for St. Theresa School, I was simply amazed and mesmerized. After all, I had seen them at practice and all I can say is that’s why they call it practice; but the show they put on was truly outstanding. The veteran troupe – splendidly dressed in black body suits with glittery red tuxedo jackets and tails offset with shining silver lapels and collars, black mesh stockings, black dance shoes, and sparkling silver top hats – performed perfectly to Beethoven’s 5th (disco version). The rookie troupe dazzled with their shining silver and black scoop-neck, long-sleeved tops (with shoulder cutouts), silver pleated skirts, flesh tone stockings, and black dance shoes as they moved in unison to “New York, New York.” Both troupes also performed flawlessly to “I Hope I Get It.”

Beaming with motherly pride at her charges’ stellar performances, Kelly proudly stated, “We dance for organizations that need a smile and a lift in their lives.”

Rules of Golf

Rule 18 – Ball at Rest Moved

New exception for 2012 18-2

By Player, partner, caddie or equipment

a. General

Except as permitted by the Rules, when a player's ball is in play, if

(i) the player, his partner or either of their caddies:

- lifts or moves the ball,
- touches it purposely (except with a club in the act of addressing the ball), or
- causes the ball to move, or

(ii) the equipment of the player or his partner causes the ball to move, the player incurs a penalty of one stroke.

If the ball is moved, it must be replaced, unless the movement of the ball occurs after the player has begun the stroke or the backward movement of the club for the stroke and the stroke is made.

Under the Rules there is no penalty if a player accidentally causes his ball to move in the following circumstances:

- In searching for a ball covered by sand, in the replacement of loose impediments moved in a hazard while finding or identifying a ball, in probing for a ball lying in water in a water hazard or in searching for a ball in an obstruction or an abnormal ground condition – Rule 12-1
- In repairing a hole plug or ball mark – Rule 16-1c
- In measuring – Rule 18-6
- In lifting a ball under a Rule – Rule 20-1
- In placing or replacing a ball under a Rule – Rule 20-3a
- In removing a loose impediment on the putting green – Rule 23-1
- In removing movable obstructions – Rule 24-1

b. Ball Moving After Address

If a player's ball in play moves after he has addressed it (other than as a result of a stroke), the player is deemed to have moved the ball and **incurs a penalty of one stroke.**

The ball must be replaced, unless the movement of the ball occurs after the player has begun the stroke or the backward movement of the club for the stroke and the stroke is made.

Exception: If it is known or virtually certain that the player did not cause his ball to move, Rule 18-2b does not apply. This new exception was added in 2012 which exonerates the player from penalty if his ball moves after it has been addressed when it is known or virtually certain that he did not cause the ball to move. For example, if it is a gust of wind that moves the ball after it has been addressed, there is no penalty and the ball is played from its new position.

10 Steps to Avoid Heat Stress While Exercising this Summer

It's getting hot outside so here are a few ways to keep you safe while exercising in the heat:

1. Drink lots and lots of water. Drink water before, during, and after you exercise. For every 15 minutes you exercise, drink at least 8 ounces of water.
2. Decrease the intensity of your exercise.
3. Plan to exercise early in the morning or late in the evening. Or, if possible, take your training indoors.
4. Give your body time to acclimate to higher temperatures. Plan on shorter and easier workouts for 7 – 14 days.
5. Wear loose, light-colored, lightweight clothing.
6. Maximize skin exposure to aid in evaporation. Don't forget to apply sunscreen.
7. Cover your head. Wear a loose, billed hat and pour water over your head periodically.
8. Change your plan to achieve a personal best that day.
9. Plan your hydration. If you're going for a long run or taking a particularly hard class the next day, drink lots of water the day and night before.
10. Listen to your body. The first stages of heat stress are muscle cramps, nausea, headaches, goose bumps on the upper body, unsteady footing, and/or a decrease or a stoppage of sweat rate. Stop exercising if you experience any of these symptoms.



Where's the check I thought was coming? Rather than paying death benefits, some insurance companies now put the proceeds into money market accounts and mail the beneficiaries a checkbook. Getting a checkbook with the insurance proceeds as the account balance may be a convenient way to hold the money while the widow(er) decides what to do with it. Those who advocate this system see it as a means of protecting the grief-stricken survivors. Others see this as an invitation to agents to come a-calling to sell financial products offered by their companies when the beneficiary is in an emotional state and can be easily persuaded.

Because the insurance company is not a fiduciary, many people feel that it's not their business what the beneficiary does with the death benefits. They feel that someone who purchases an insurance policy enters into a binding contract with the company, which agrees to pay the face amount of the policy at death and that there's no hand-holding called for in the policy.

A good idea is to inquire of the insurance company that issues your life insurance policies to find out their current practices. You'll have time to make your desires known.
