## From the General Manager

### Why Do We Need Reserves?

A couple of years ago, I discussed reserves and why we need them in my monthly article. Since the Association is currently in the process of doing the 2013 budget, I thought that I would provide information on reserves again since it is one of the biggest components of our annual budget. Equipment and major components (like streets) must be repaired or replaced from time to time. Generally, community associations prefer to plan and set aside funds over the life of the major components. The Association puts a portion of your monthly assessment into the reserve accounts so when the component needs repair or replacement the funds are available. Reserve funds aren't an extra expense – they just spread out expenses more evenly. There are several important reasons why associations put monies into reserves each month.

- Reserve funds meet legal, fiduciary and professional requirements that may be required by 1) secondary mortgage markets, 2) state statutes, regulations or court decisions or 3) the community's governing documents.
- Reserve funds provide for major repairs and replacement that we know will be necessary at some point in time. For example, as we will be shortly experiencing some of our streets will need to be slurry sealed to enhance the life of the streets. Since this is a common element, all owners share in this cost through their monthly contribution to the reserve fund.
- Reserve funds minimize the need for special assessments or borrowing.
- Reserve funds enhance resale values. Lenders and real estate agents are aware of the ramifications for new buyers if the reserves are inadequate. Many states require associations to disclose the amounts in their reserve funds to prospective buyers.

Every summer staff works with our reserve study specialist to update the reserve study and to make sure that any new components have been considered and that the reserve study reflects reserve funding for these new components. The most recently updated reserve study for the fiscal year 2013 shows that the level of funding of our reserve fund is approximately 100% or fully funded. This healthy reserve fund indicates that we will have adequate funding for needed repair and replacement during the current year.

### Some Events to Watch For

On October 10 at 6:30 pm, the Board of Directors will hold a Residents Forum for the purpose of providing information about a possible expansion of the restaurant. Please plan on attending this forum to be held in the Ballroom at the Montecito Clubhouse. There will be a presentation and an opportunity for questions and comments from residents.

On October 16 at 6 pm, the Association in conjunction with the Veterans Club will be hosting an Indio City Council Candidates Forum. Please join us in the Ballroom at the Montecito Clubhouse to hear what the candidates who are running for Indio City Council present. The format will be similar to our annual board of director candidate forum with opening statements, questions and closing statements by each candidate.

If you have any questions please feel free to contact the Association staff. We will be glad to help you or direct your questions to the proper staff member so that your questions are answered in a timely manner. The Association office staff is looking forward to assisting you.

## Employee of the Month September 2012





### **Overseeding Time**

For you lucky homeowners with lawns, it's time to overseed again. The Design Review Guidelines state: "All front lawn areas must be overseeded on an annual basis (generally September/October) with a Winter Rye grass. Overseeding must be accomplished by November 30th of each year."

Picking the correct time to overseed is crucial. If you do it too early, the hot temperature will make it hard for the seedlings to survive. Too late and it will take much longer for the grass to establish itself. The maximum you are looking for is a combined daily temperature (high and low) of 150 degrees. Example: a high of 90 and a low of 60 degrees. At this warm temperature, the rye grass should start growing in about five days. If you wait until mid-November, with the lower temperatures, it will take about two weeks for the seed to germinate and your lawn will fill in slowly. Normally, you should be able to overseed around October 8, but I have seen 110 degrees on that date in 1996, so monitor the 150 degree rule.

Water to keep the seed wet until it germinates, then, start cutting back on your watering time. The seed has enough nutrients to sustain itself for about two weeks, but after that you must fertilize to keep your grass growing. You can use a 15-15-15 or other "starter" fertilizer. Then, every three weeks until the low temperature reaches the 40s, use 21-7-14. 15.5-0-0 is good during the winter.



## 2012 Harvest Festival Ramps Up

Mark your calendars for this year's Harvest Festival on Saturday, November 3 from 9 am – 4 pm. This year the excitement ramps up with a juried selection of specialty vendors, which promises to appeal to every taste and budget.

The diverse offerings include hand-made jewelry; unique clothing items, such as recycled denim products like purses; knit and crocheted items plus stitchery; a variety of mixed arts, such as oils, watercolors, custom-painted tiles, whimsical wind chimes and glass items; and locally produced specialty food items. There are 28 vendors new to the Harvest Festival, which includes hand-made dolls with individually embroidered faces and clever sewing accessories made from recycled mason jars. And don't forget the holiday items.

The Ceramics Club is once again organizing the festival. The club started five years ago with a few neophytes and one woman who knew a little something about the process. Today they have 52 members and

meet twice a week. This will be the second year they have tackled the entire project. Their lofty purpose is to raise enough money for the club to buy and install another kiln, which carries an approximate price tag of \$4,500. They raised just less than half last year and hope to reach their goal this year.

Paula Nadel, club president, and Sheila Cohen, festival co-chair, have been hard at work for months pulling it all together. They sorted through entries to find the 65 most interesting. There are 12 fewer vendors than last year to make better use of the space and ease people congestion. Each vendor pays a table fee, but the Ceramics Club does not take a cut of any profit from the vendors.

All club members participate in various roles. Members volunteer to coordinate pre-event activities such

as advertising, raffle items, and physical booth layouts. They also take charge of the actual day-of work such as the bake sale and coffee table (how can you miss this?). They coordinate vendor spaces, handle the door prizes, and food. All members contribute to the bake sale.

The great team of “ceramic men,” i.e., the husbands, will once again prepare and sell the food at the barbeque on the north patio. This will be “hot dogs with all the fixins” including chili, along with chips and a drink. The food booth opens at 11 am. It’s a fantastic social opportunity to meet and greet in our beautiful patio area.

There will be multiple glamorous and generous door prizes drawn hourly throughout the day. Winners will be posted on a large board near the

front door. Attendees can check the board on their way out to see if they have won a prize. Winners need not be present.

Paula wishes to thank everyone for making this festival the best it can be. We all acknowledge what a lot of work goes into something like this, from the club members to the vendor efforts. Paula added that they could not pull it off without the help of the SCSH set-up/clean-up crew. It’s a true community event and one that our residents can enjoy and be proud of. Bravo to all the volunteers, employees, and shoppers who make this work!

# Cairo and Luxor, Egypt: A Trip between Uprisings

Have you always wanted the adventure of traveling to see the Pyramids in Egypt or cruising down the Nile? In August of 2011, Ted and Norma Nelson were invited to Norma's grandnephew's bar mitzvah in Jerusalem. They had been to Jerusalem the previous year with six couples from here at Sun City Shadow Hills so it wasn't in their plans to return, but family means everything to both of them so they agreed to go. If they were going to do this trip, they had to add a new adventure, a new country to visit. Ted was high on Egypt, but Norma, not so much. Some friends had reported about the poverty and filth which Norma had seen on previous third world travels, and, along with the political unrest, the thought of going to Egypt made her uncomfortable. After Ted's research and enthusiasm about the archaeology, the ancient

culture, and the experience, she agreed to go.

If you ask them about this trip, you might think they were not on the same one. Although neither of them were too enthusiastic about the food, Norma's disappointment focused on the security that prevented her from visiting with the people, shopping in the markets, eating in the local restaurants, and feeling the freedom to get one's own pulse of the country. Not only did they have a driver and a guide, but they were also accompanied by an armed security guard in a business suit. Although this trip occurred during Ramadan and the relatively quiet period between the spring and autumn uprisings, the tensions were still somewhat high.

Norma felt little kids forever at her side, hawking, begging, pestering her at every turn. On the advice of other Egyptian tourists, she brought some fifty ball point pens from the United States and when she handed

them out to some children, "Others seemed to come out of the dirt. I had only fifty ball point pens for more than a hundred kids. Out of nowhere, they surrounded me. The poverty is overwhelming. These kids have nothing."

Norma's luggage did not arrive on their plane to Cairo and it was a nightmare. After much inquiry, the airline had not retrieved it as promised. During the holy days of Ramadan no one was going to move that luggage in spite of the guide's false prediction that the bags would be there. She and Ted were to board a plane the next day for Luxor so she was concerned about not having changed her clothes for two days and not having her attire for the bar mitzvah celebration later that week in Israel. Since they were not allowed to leave the hotel without an escort, a call at 11 pm to their guide requesting him to come to the hotel to take them to the airport was not well received. A very insistent

Norma, however, after much negotiation with the guide, convinced him to get in a cab and pick them up at the hotel. They personally retrieved their bags at the airport at two in the morning. After returning to the hotel and with maybe two hours of sleep, they headed back to the airport for their flight to Luxor.

From Ted's point of view, the trip was an important affirmation of what he learned in childhood about the start of civilization. Ted felt, "to actually be in the land of the pharaohs, to tread on that same ground, to touch things that other people touched 5,000 years ago, is truly amazing stuff." He loved visiting the pyramids in Giza, although his expectation from photos was that they were in the midst of a lonely desert. A mere twenty minute drive from Cairo, Giza is in the suburbs with a Pizza Hut within blocks of the historic site. Along with the shops, the bustle of the crowds, and the traffic dispelled that notion of desert isolation. Seeing the mummies of the tombs of Ramses II and Queen Hatshepsut in the National Museum in Cairo and King Tut's tomb and mummy in the Valley of the Kings in Luxor made the trip worthwhile for both Ted and Norma. These tombs and the mummies depicted tiny people, appearing not more than five feet

tall. Viewing first hand these ancient artifacts gave them great satisfaction.

Ted and Norma both experienced amazement with the traffic, "The cars went in every direction. It was scary for us although our driver would not flinch even when a car going 60 miles per hour crossed immediately in front of him. No order seems to exist."

As they rode in the van through the streets of Cairo, they observed a variety of dresses among the women, a few burkas, lots of women in jeans, and almost all with head scarves. They witnessed no discriminatory behavior toward the women. "Their discourse seemed to be normal," said Ted. "Our guide told us that dress for women in Cairo was a matter of personal choice."

The Nelsons met one American couple in Luxor. Very few tourists were visiting Egypt at the time so there were no long lines; but for Egypt this was quite sad because the lack of tourists have added to their severely distressed economy. Norma and Ted enjoyed their trip to Egypt in spite of being in a third world nation when a revolution, although an undercurrent at the time, was going on.

# Grey Matters: The Elephant Experience

The literature described “an inter-active education walk” with “semi-habituated elephants.” My husband Bob and I thought it sounded like fun. Count us in. But as we approached the elephants that thought quickly morphed to “What have I gotten us into?” They are the giants of Africa. And they are huge.

In July 2011, we had the opportunity to visit Elephant Island, an isolated spit of land in the heart of Botswana’s Okavango Delta. There we met Doug Groves who has committed his life to caring for and training three orphaned African elephants.

Jabu is a bull and the biggest of the three. The name is short for Jabulani, which means “happiness” in Zulu. That is a perfect description. Adopted as a traumatized two-year-old orphan as a result of a culling operation in Kruger National Park in South Africa, he was barely three feet tall. Today, Jabu is 24 years old, stands almost 13 feet at the shoulder, and is well-adjusted and friendly. He loves to learn and delights in showing off for his visitors. He is the anchor to this small herd.

Thembi, short for Thembigela or “trust” in Zulu, was adopted with Jabu and is also 24 years old. She is the smallest and looks like a toy next to Jabu. She simply must be the center of attention and is cute and boisterous as a result. Doug called her “the princess.”

Morula was adopted as a troubled teen-ager from Zimbabwe. She had been sold to a family as a pet, along with a bull who eventually killed a man. Then they were

sold to a park where the bull went on a destructive rampage and had to be put down. Morula was offered to Doug as a lone elephant with severe anti-social behaviors. Today she is 35 years old and a self-confident elephant happy to belong to this unique herd.


Doug Groves, originally from Oregon, worked with elephants in zoos and wildlife parks for 15 years on the West Coast. He moved to South Africa in 1987 to train the elephants for the movie “*Circles in A Forest*,” based on the book by Daleen Mathee. It was then that he discovered the two orphaned elephants and started caring for them. Doug and his wife Sandi, a University of Natal, South Africa, zoologist, committed themselves to the life-long care of these gentle giants, as elephants often live to 70 years.

As tourists, our day started off with introductions. We met couples from South Africa and Germany. We also met Leano, a local man who was trained as an elephant guardian; he primarily cared for Morula. After some very simple “do’s” and “don’ts” (like never run from the animals and approach only when invited), we met the elephants. First we felt Jabu’s skin. Then we felt the trunk. Then we held his trunk.

At Doug’s direction, Jabu picked up his trunk and placed it into our waiting arms. It was so heavy! All the while, Doug was saying sweet things to Jabu, like we would say while training a dog, i.e., “Good boy, Jabu,” “Wonderful, Jabu.”

At one point, Jabu decided he was more interested in unearthing a tree root. Doug issued a stern “Leave it, Jabu, leave it” and the giant elephant dropped it and turned away from the tree. Jabu was so well behaved. By then, we were all more comfortable and began our trek.

When we stopped in the shade, Doug instructed Jabu to sit down and roll out against an incline on a small mound. There we were able to study his feet. African elephants have four toes in the front legs and three toes in the back legs. The toes are made of keratin, same as our nails. The similarity stops there, however, as the center of an elephant’s foot is a gelatinous sponge, like a tire. This gives them the ability to better traverse the different terrain on their long foraging treks. If only, I thought, my feet were made of adaptable, built-in shock absorbers!

We felt the tusks, smooth as satin and strong as silk brocade. One of Morula’s tusks had been broken off during a teen-age scuffle. As a top incisor, it will continue to grow. But the damaged end will never repair itself. Her eyelashes were very long and coarse.

For sun protection, we each wore a hat. On cue, Jabu would take a hat off a head, put it on

his own, take a bow, and then replace the hat on the head. It seemed to be as much fun for him as it was for us. He put mine on crooked, with the visor to the side, and Doug gave him a command to re-do it. I still haven’t washed the elephant drool off my cap!

We eventually wandered over to a linen-covered table where a beautiful picnic lunch was set up. The three elephants joined us a couple of feet away, munching on grasses and trees, in Leano’s care. To the untrained eye, they seemed delighted to have lunch guests.

We had an hour of “Kodak moments” after lunch. One by one, the elephants came to the table to visit and pose for pictures. We stood and all three came to lay their heavy trunks on our shoulders. Inquisitive Thembi had a hard time keeping her trunk from wandering. They followed this up with a round of cheek-kissing. As we departed, we turned to say good-bye to the sweetest giants ever encountered. As we waved, they waved their trunks back at us. Even as the jeeps pulled away, I couldn’t resist one last glance. They were still waving. It made my heart sing.

# Mel Borses, the Original Little Big Man

There are over five thousand stories in the naked city, this is one of them. Mel Borses, five feet three inches and still shrinking, may be small in stature but he has a big heart, a fondness for family values, an abundance of humor, and a passion for helping people. Some of you may have seen him act and sing in the SCSH production shows *Bye, Bye Birdie*, *Light Up the Sky*, *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying*, and *And Then There Were None*, and most recently, as a member of the Community Singers production of, "100 Years of Broadway" (just look for the short guy with the salt and pepper hair and glasses).

Born in 1939 in the shadows of that steel and concrete playground called Yankee Stadium in New York City, Mel, his two older brothers and his loving and hard working parents lived in a one bedroom walk up tenement building. Five other families on the floor hailed from different parts of the world and although not related, they were still considered family. These were the days of unlocked doors and everyone watching out for


everyone else's kids. Mel remembers growing up playing stickball, kick the can, and Johnny on a pony. In 1954 the Borses family moved to a larger home in Queens. He likes to say that they moved from a neighborhood of tough guys with slick backed hair, blue jeans, black motorcycle boots and Marlboros tucked into the sleeve of a t-shirt to the plush manicured lawns and emerald ivy walls of Kew Gardens.

It was in high school that Mel met Rose, the girl of his dreams and his lifetime partner. Last year they celebrated their 50th Anniversary with a marvelous African Safari to Kenya, Tanzania, Zimbabwe, and Botswana. 

## Book Review

### Drowning Ruth By Christina Schwarz

This is an emotionally fraught novel about family (especially the female members), relationships and secrets (always a good choice for an engrossing novel), overlaid with a sense of impending doom and melancholy. Aided by her choice of locale and era, the author has given her readers a word portrait of a lonely outpost of mid-America between the two world wars. The gloom of what seems like perpetual winter hangs over the Wisconsin farm area near an ice-bound island that is the setting for this work.

The characters include two sisters and the offspring of the younger...Ruth. The elder sister, Amanda, has always looked after Matilda and, although she is sad about losing her to a husband, she loves her and tries to help when she can. When Matilda's husband leaves for the war, Amanda comes home from Milwaukee where she has been nursing returning soldiers and dealing with the Spanish Influenza. She and Mattie move to the island near their farm with Mattie's small daughter, Ruth.


Tragedy ensues with an accident to Matilda, and Amanda and her demons are left to raise Ruth and keep Mattie's memory alive. The secrets are there to be guessed by the reader (or not) and the action continues with Amanda's regrets, guilt and painful remembrances suffocating her (and poor Ruth). Amanda's narration gives clues to us, but somewhat surprisingly, not to herself. We know something has happened, but we don't know what.

Mattie's widower returns home and because of the close-mouthed Amanda and her diversionary tactics when the subject arises, he believes many things about his beloved that are not true. He's also taken aback by Amanda's fierce and protective feelings for Ruth, for the farm...for everyday routines that he might have supposed he could have handled.

The naiveté and illusions of this small community are probably accurate for that time and place in the United States. Far different from our own age, it is interesting for that reason alone. We do not doubt that the characters are acting in light of their own culture and upbringing, no matter how odd they seem to us. No questions are asked that might occur to us immediately, but, again, this is almost 100 years ago...another time and place.

This was a selection of Oprah's Book Club ©2000 and has received spectacular reviews, not least because of the style of narration: Amanda and Ruth have their own sections interspersed with the third-person narrator, a difficult feat which the author has handled very well.

## Golf Operations

### 2012 Fall Overseeding Dates and Information

- North Course: Closed from 9/24 – 10/14/12
- South Course: Closed from 10/15 – 11/4/12

Every fall we oversee the dormant Bermuda grass with cool season Ryegrass. Part of that procedure includes scalping the Bermuda grass to provide good growing conditions for the new Ryegrass. This scalping process often creates a considerable amount of grass dust which tends to blow into the residences around the golf course. Each year we scalp the same areas two to three times in the first two weeks of closure, so *please keep that in mind when cleaning your backyards or pools. It may not necessarily make sense for you to thoroughly clean after the first or second scalping, knowing that the area may be dusted again the following week.*

In 2008 the roughs at Shadow Hills were not overseeded. The “rough” is all areas of turf excluding tees, fairways and greens. We have chosen not to overseed *the rough* this fall as well. The rough will go dormant and have a golden brown color. We will chemically treat the rough so that it stays as evenly brown as possible. This practice has been recommended for Shadow Hills by the USGA Green Section, an independent third party Golf Course Turf Advisory service.

Overseeding can be very stressful for Bermuda grass, and every three years the Bermuda grass should be permitted to go dormant and not be scalped and overseeded. This creates better turf conditions in the summer, due to the turf grass not having to “transition” in the late spring. This is particularly noticeable in the high traffic, high impact areas

## Rules of Golf

This month I would like to reference a rule that prohibits “preparing” the area where a player is about to drop or place a ball. I have highlighted portions of the rule below which are relative to this issue.

### Rule 13-2

#### Improving Lie, Area of Intended Stance or Swing, or Line of Play

A player must not improve or allow to be improved:

- the position or lie of his ball,
- the area of his intended stance or swing,
- his line of play or a reasonable extension of that line beyond the hole, or
- the area in which he is to drop or place a ball,

by any of the following actions:

- pressing a club on the ground,
- moving, bending or breaking anything growing or fixed (including immovable obstructions and objects defining out of bounds),
- creating or eliminating irregularities of surface,
- removing or pressing down sand, loose soil, replaced divots or other cut turf placed in position, or
- removing dew, frost or water.

However, the player incurs no penalty if the action occurs:

- in grounding the club lightly when addressing the ball,
- in fairly taking his stance,
- in making a stroke or the backward movement of his club for a stroke and the stroke is made,
- in creating or eliminating irregularities of surface within the teeing ground or in removing dew, frost or water from the teeing ground, or
- on the putting green in removing sand and loose soil or in repairing damage (Rule 16-1).

Exception: Ball in hazard – see Rule 13-4.

created by golf carts. These areas transition poorly each year, partly because they aren't as healthy as a result of the overseeding process.

We understand that some of our residents value the green turf near their residence, and would like to see it be green all winter. Two benefits to a homeowner from not overseeding roughs are less irrigation being used near the homes (less overspray), and less grass clippings which may blow into yards and pools. We appreciate your patience as we seek to improve the turf grass condition throughout the property for years to come.

### *Players Cards and Trail Fees*

The Shadow Hills Players Card and Private Cart Trail Fees will be available for purchase on October 15, 2012. This is the first day that the South Course closes for overseeding, and the first day that the North Course reopens.

We strongly encourage you to renew your Player's Card when the South Course is closed for overseeding. This will help minimize the lines and wait time in the golf shop when the South Course reopens.

Below is a short Q&A that will help you decide on which card to obtain.

**Q:** Do you expect to play the South Course more than 3 times per year?

**A:** Purchase the Player's Card at the South Course golf shop for \$45, which provides SCSH Residents discounted rates at both the North and South course.

**Q:** Do you plan to play the North course primarily and expect to play the South Course less than 3 times per year?

**A:** Sign up for the free North Course Only Players Card at the North Course golf shop.

\*Please do not sign-up for a North Course Only card if you expect to sign-up at a later date for the South Course card. Your accrued points will not transfer to your new card.



## Retirement Club



### Retired Spouse IRA Strategy:

Thinking of dumping your mate? Here’s an income tax reason to hold on until after the end of the year. When one spouse works and the other does not, tax law allows the non-working spouse to base their contribution to an IRA on the income of the working spouse.

This tax benefit is frequently overlooked when spouses have been working and basing their individual contributions on their own income for years, retire and fail to recognize the opportunity to make IRA contributions for a retired spouse. Even if the working spouse has a pension plan at work and his or her income precludes him or her from making an IRA contribution, the non-working retired spouse can still make a contribution based on the working spouse’s income.

However, be careful since traditional IRA contributions, both deductible and nondeductible, are not allowed in the year an individual turns 70-½ and all subsequent years. This restriction does not apply to Roth IRA contributions.

There are some Adjusted Gross Income limitations if the working spouse has a retirement plan at work, so please review the rules to make sure you qualify before making the contribution.
