## Employee of the Month October 2012




### *Daniel Lopez*

## Committee Reports



### *Design Review*

Homeowners with lawns, a reminder the Design Review Guidelines state that overseeding must be accomplished by November 30 of each year. The HOA staff will be checking lawns in mid-November and sending letters to homeowners who have not overseeded, reminding them that the task must be accomplished by November 30. If you still have not overseeded by November 30, you will receive a letter that you are in violation of the Guidelines and will have two weeks to complete the task. Failure to overseed after this will result in a hearing and a possible fine. Overseeding after November 30 usually results in a thinner stand of grass due to the cooler temperatures at that time.

If you live on a corner lot, you may have a stop sign or a street sign on your property. Be sure to keep your trees trimmed so these signs are not obstructed by tree branches. Otherwise, you will receive a letter telling you to trim your trees for safety reasons. DO NOT remove more than 20% of the tree's canopy any time you trim. The trees need their leaves to make food to sustain them or they will have to use the limited amount of food stored in their roots to get by.

The recent wind storm toppled many trees. If you removed the tree, you need to replace it. Plant the same tree, no application. Article V, Section 5.10 of the Association's Design Rules requires two trees in the front yard of every lot.

As we get ready to welcome back our seasonal residents, the Security Committee would like to advise all residents to be “security-smart” and help us maintain a safe community. In spite of a rash of home burglaries in similar gated communities in the Valley, we have been very lucky to date and have had relatively few incidents in the last 12 months. However, we did have two home burglaries in September. One was forced entry; the other was because the rear sliding glass door was left open when the resident left the property. Neither home had an alarm.

In order to be “security-smart” we are asking all residents at minimum to take a few simple precautions:

- 1.) Make sure all doors and windows are locked and secure.
- 2.) Purchase an alarm.
- 3.) If you plan to be out of town, advise Security.
- 4.) Always keep a watchful eye for anything out of the ordinary and call Security if you see something suspicious.

receive this service, you must first sign a “Permission to Enter Property and Release of Liability” agreement. This agreement must be signed before receiving the first response/first call phone number. You may obtain the form at the Administration Office Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 am – 12 pm and 1 – 4 pm. The phone number will be made available to you after the agreement has been signed by the property owner and returned to the Administration Office.

# Drive Against Hunger Charity Golf Tournament

The inaugural Cabazon Band of Mission Indians' Drive Against Hunger Charity Golf Tournament, played in April 2012 at the beautiful Fantasy Springs Eagle Falls Golf Course, was an overwhelming success. The event raised \$20,000 for Martha's Village and Kitchen, Well in the Desert, and the FIND Food Bank. The funds are helping to supplement their food distribution programs.

A year earlier, Sue Henricksen, a resident of Sun City Shadow Hills (SCSH), had a dream that a group of enthusiastic volunteers from SCSH could orchestrate a golf tournament fundraiser to benefit local agencies dedicated to feeding the hungry. members of the golf steering committee jumped on board. Shortly thereafter Gary Kelly, Bud Nautel, Diane Phillips, and Arnold Choy joined the robust committee.

Gary, who works for the Cabazon Band of Mission Indians (Tribe), was instrumental in laying the groundwork with the Tribe, who own the casino and golf course. He was

also deeply involved with gathering donations and communications logistics.

When David Roosevelt, Chairman of the Tribe, announced that they would donate the golf course for the inaugural event, the elated committee started meeting weekly at Sue's house to do the intricate planning. Gloria was in charge of the golfers, tee times, and other golf course logistics; Bud and Arnold were responsible for donations and advertising; Julie and Diane handled the volunteers; June kept track of all of the prizes; and Barrie assisted Sue while also providing support to the entire committee.

Led by Sue's intense drive and commitment, the committee members completed their assignments by procuring many tournament volunteers, sponsors, donors, 32 foursomes, customized trophies, prizes, and even more prizes. Trophies were awarded to Team Low Gross and Team Low Net winners as well as second- and third-place teams. # The Palm Springs Art Museum in Palm Desert

The Palm Springs Art Museum has had a dream for a very long time to share its treasures with the Coachella Valley in the well-located city of Palm Desert. For the first time in nearly 75 years, that dream has come true with the opening of the Palm Springs Art Museum in Palm Desert last March. Located in the former Visitors Center at Highway 111 and west El Paseo in the *Entrada del Paseo* center, the museum sits between two great restaurants and next to the Chamber of Commerce, where the Wednesday farmer’s market thrives. Last fall, the Visitors Center moved to El Paseo to accommodate more foot traffic.

The building, also called *The Galen*, was designed by architect Reuel A. Young of Interactive Design Corporation. It was originally built

in 2005 with 8,400 square feet and is LEED-certified (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) ...the first in the valley to be Silver rated.

The interior of the building boasts intimate gallery spaces that will feature rotating exhibitions and a new media and photography gallery to display works of contemporary and art historical significance.

The embroidery was based on a pattern outlined on soft fabric. Sarelle began on the basket section thinking that would take the most work. “The TV was going and I was stitching,” Sarelle recalls. Embroidery stitching, as I learned, is moving the embroidery needle from

the backside of a fabric to the front side and back again through the fabric, which is held tightly in place by an embroidery hoop. Embroidery differs from needlepoint, which uses a stiff canvas that has openings at regular spaces.

Embroidery may seem simple; but the variety of threads, needles, and stitches required makes it a challenge. Sarelle used over 25 distinctive color threads. “I spent a lot of time at JoAnn’s and Michaels,” she laughingly said. What’s more, some of the different threads required her to change to different needles. Needle in hand, she then had to execute an assortment of stitches including flat, running, laid, and French knot, to mention a few. In fact, her winning embroidery has over 1,000 French knots. She estimates

the entire embroidery required over 10,000 individual hand stitches.

So, for two to three hours on many evenings, Sarelle sat precisely placing her needle and building brushstrokes of thread that would eventually result in a painting-like finished embroidery.

As you can imagine, the effort required patience and concentration. Sarelle had shown patience before. When living in Illinois, she decided to go back to college to complete the BA she began years before at UCLA. She majored in Humanities with an emphasis in Art History and graduated Magna Cum Laude. But part of her classwork was taking Studio Art. “I could do the conceptual part, but I couldn’t draw or paint,” Sarelle remembers. “So I had to take my time and practice patience. I worked hard at that class and finally got an A.”

After her degree, Sarelle was able to use her art knowledge by managing an art gallery out of her home. She later did the same when living in Brentwood, CA. Indeed, much of the art in her current home includes pieces shown in her own gallery. Her children, Marc, Lance, and

Keyla, also have many of her art pieces.

Having lived through the initial days of modern feminism, Sarelle was an early proponent of women in the arts. In the 80s she met Wilhelmina Holladay, who was trying to start a museum dedicated to women's art. By supporting and contributing to Holladay's efforts, Sarelle was named a founding member of the National Museum of Women in the Arts (NMWA), located in Washington D.C.

These days, as she and her husband Steve travel around the world, Sarelle still finds and purchases art that represents the culture of the place they're visiting.

Steve, also detail oriented, was involved in the award-winning embroidery effort. "I helped by investigating the details of getting into the Fair, taking care of the online application, and getting the work to the judges by the required deadline," reported Steve. "Going through the process was enjoyable, and we both learned a lot."

Sarelle doesn't limit her creativity to embroidery. She has been a member of the SCSH Ceramics Club since its inception. She and fellow member Mike Hanson recently organized all the club molds for the coming season. Sarelle believes that the patience and concentration she applied to her embroidery is also important to ceramics. "Most people come into the club saying, 'I can't draw. I can't paint.' But then they make

such wonderful pieces. You just have to concentrate and do things the best you can. You can't just dash something off in ceramics." Many club members proudly sell their pieces at the Harvest Festival. Sarelle invites interested residents to try their hand at ceramics.

Sarelle does not expect to be entering another embroidery piece in the Riverside County Fair in the future. "My eyesight and arthritis won't let me," she states sadly. "But I expect to

enter my ceramics pieces." Many members of the Ceramics Club have had winning pieces at the Fair. Sarelle hopes to join them.

## Rules of Golf

### **The rules of golf and man's best friend**

Although dogs aren't permitted on our golf course, occasionally a stray sometimes find its way onto the putting green. Here's what the Rules of Golf have to say in the event the dog causes trouble.

#### **Rule 19-1/6**

#### **Ball Picked Up or Deflected by Dog on Putting Green After Stroke from Off Green**

**Q.** A ball played from off the green was about a foot from the hole and still in motion when it was moved by a dog to a spot about ten feet from the hole. The ball was either deflected by the dog or the dog picked it up, ran with it and dropped it. What is the ruling?

**A.** If the ball was deflected, it would be played as it lay, without penalty, from the spot to which it was moved by the dog (Rule 19-1).

If the dog picked up the ball, the player should have placed the ball, without penalty, as near as possible to the spot where the original ball was when the dog picked it up (Rule 19-1a).

#### **Rule 19-1/7**

#### **Ball Picked Up or Deflected by Dog on Putting Green After Stroke on Green**

**Q.** A player plays a stroke on the putting green and, while the ball is still in motion, it is picked up and carried away, or is deflected, by a dog. What is the ruling?

**A.** In either case, the stroke is canceled and the ball must be replaced (Rule 19-1b).

Other Decisions related to Rule 19-1: See "Ball Deflected or Stopped: by outside agency" in the Index.



## Opera Club



We have a treat in store at our November 13 meeting: Mozart's *The Ab-*

*duction from the Seraglio*, which was an instant success when it premiered in Vienna on July 16, 1782. In a letter to his father on July 27, Mozart wrote, "My opera was given yesterday with big applause for the third time. In spite of the terrible summer heat, the theatre was packed. It really feels good to hear this kind of applause."

Anything Turkish was in style at the time, and the opera's story of virtuous women rescued from a Turkish harem was true to the trend. And the fact that Mozart spiced up his music with Turkish-sounding percussion and piccolos helped push the opera into venues of 40 different cities during the composer's brief lifetime. - Presuming that all investment products sold by banks are insured. Many banks offer non-insured products.
- Buying mutual fund shares late in the year. Most mutual funds make annual capital gain allocations late in the year. If you purchase right before these allocations, you'll receive significant taxable income.
- Forgetting about the “wash sale” rules. Selling at a loss within thirty days of the previous sale, results in the loss becoming nondeductible for tax purposes.
- Relying on hot tips. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably isn't true.

two – three pages of something you have written to read to our group.


