





The list will also include whatever opportunities there are to volunteer here inside Sun City Shadow Hills with the Association. We know some residents would rather work here inside the community, so we will be sure to have those positions posted as well.

Why this new focus on volunteerism? A couple of reasons. First, we already know it's happening, and residents who volunteer with the Association and therefore help us cut salary costs deserve whatever thanks we can give them. So too do those residents who give of their time to help improve our greater Coachella Valley community. The second reason is, just like golf, tennis, swimming or other exercise, a hobby or a craft, volunteering is a Lifestyle choice. The Heat Is Upon Us - *Entertainment Heat That Is*


OK, Sun City Shadows Hills residents, the summer heat is upon us, but we are not just referring to the outside temperature; we are talking about all of the great Lifestyle events that are planned for our entertainment this summer. They are HOT!!

There is certainly something for everybody in the months to come. Cool-off activities include a pool party on Saturday morning, June 13, and ice cream socials held on Friday each month starting with June. Day trips are planned to get out of the heat including a baseball game (Father's Day June 20 and September 11), Sawdust Art Festival & Rogers Gardens on August 12, Griffith Observatory on August 12, Big Bear Lake on August 26, and Julian Apple Harvest on October 17.

If you interested in longer trips, there are two cruises offered – an Alaskan Cruise in August and a Roman Empire Cruise in September.

But the heat really goes on when we look at the concerts and festivals planned for the summer into the New Year. One can almost say with all the events planned SCSH and Indio can become a new Mecca for entertainment. Look at our lineup:

It all starts with comedy. On Sunday, June 14 we will host a great comedy show with two very different comedians: Tom Ogden & Jack Kalvan.



Tom Ogden is a combination magician/comedian. He brings to the stage more than 30 years of professional touring, beginning when – straight out of college – he ran away with the Clyde Beatty-Cole Bros. Circus. Before long, Tom traded the tinsel-and-sawdust of the circus ring for the glitter-and-sequins of Las Vegas, Atlantic City and Lake Tahoe. Along the way, he's opened for such varied acts as Billy Crystal, The Osmonds, B.J. Thomas and Robin Williams. He has twice been voted "Magician of the Year" at the world-famous Magic Castle in Hollywood.

Jack Kalvan is a combination comedian/juggler. His show is a study in fine entertainment – engaging premises, challenging juggling made to seem effortless, and great lines delivered with perfect timing, all filtered through a persona unwilling to take life seriously. Jack engages the audience

and keeps them laughing, while performing seemingly impossible feats of dexterity.

Adding to the fun, Jack involves audience members without insult or embarrassment.

Not only is he fun to watch, but he could make a resident the star of the show. He has had guest appearances on many TV shows including *The Drew Carey Show*, *NCIS*, and *Days of our Lives* and has appeared in more than 3,000 shows in over 200 cities and in many different venues including cruise ships, fairs, casinos, TV and movies.



The entertainment continues with music – jazz to start with. On July 11 and 12 SCSH will present its first Jazz Festival, devoting the entire weekend to jazz and culminating with a jazz concert on Sunday afternoon. The entertainment will be provided by The Eric Ekstrand Ensemble, an exciting "small" Big Band covering the best Swing Era standards, exciting Jump Swing tunes and originals from their recently released album.




This group is known as one of the premier swing groups on the West Coast. The Festival will also feature art and food vendors at the Clubhouse and a cocktail reception.

Following on August 8 and 9 is a concert remembering Woodstock on its 40th anniversary. We will relive the late 60s and the nostalgia of the love generation through a series

of Woodstock-themed music, activities and food, including a tie dye party so everyone can dress in a 60s-looking outfit. A wine reception and concert on Sunday afternoon will feature the musical group The Summer of Love - a group right out of Haight Ashbury, Monterey Pop and Woodstock complete with colorful wardrobe, psychedelic lighting and fog.

The show brings alive the spirit and signature hits of the era replicating the greatest rock legends - Janis Joplin, Jimi Hendrix, John Fogerty, Sly Stone, Arlo Guthrie, Alvin Lee, Grace Slick, and Keith Moon.

The summer concert series concludes on September 12 with our very own Del Webb Music Festival. This will be a performance by the “best” of local talent who will compete through an open-call audition in front of a resident audience. Residents will rate their favorite entertainers, and the top vote-getters will share in a cash prize and be contracted for future engagements. To date several acts have signed up including a Dean Martin tribute singer, several swing bands, and some of Jim Borax's talent review who competed at the McCallum Theatre's open call.



The scheduled entertainment continues into the Fall and New Year with another great schedule of musical events. Freddie “Boom Boom” Cannon will appear on Sunday November 8 with two performances at 3:30 and 7:30 pm.

In 1959 and the early 1960s, singing under the stage name, Freddy Cannon, and dubbed "Boom Boom" because of his thundering musical renditions, he had three Top 10 hits: Tallahassee Lassie, Way Down Yonder In New Orleans, and Palisades Park. All three records sold over one million copies, attaining gold disc status.



To close out the year we will bring back some more good old days on New Year's Eve with not one, but two great vocal groups of the past: the Marvelettes and The Drifters.

Motown's first successful female vocal group, the Marvelettes are most notable for recording the company's first US #1 pop hit, “Please Mr. Postman”, and for setting the precedent for later girl groups such as Martha and the Vandellas and The Supremes.

During their eight-year run on the Billboard charts, the group scored nineteen Top Forty R&B singles and ten Top Forty pop singles including hits like Your Heart Belongs To Me, Beachwood 4-5789, Too Many Fish In the Sea, I'll Keep Holding On, and Don't Mess With Bill.

The Drifters are a musical group committed to keeping alive the name and sounds of the Fifties. They link Fifties rhythm & blues with Sixties soul music and epitomized the vocal group sound of New



York City. Theirs was the sweet but streetwise sound of R&B suffused with gospel influences. Some of their songs include Save the Last Dance for Me, There Goes My Baby, Money Honey, Some Kind of Wonderful, This Magic Moment, and Such a Night.

Their groundbreaking doo-wop version of White Christmas remains second only to Bing Crosby's in popularity.

So the heat goes on...and so does the beat. Although this preview only takes us through New Year's Eve, there are lots more events, concerts and festivals planned in 2010. Check back with the Fall issue of *The View* for more. In the meantime, check with the Lifestyle Desk for further details on all the events described in this article.

Happy Father's Day

This is a special day for children; it should be a day for them to let their father know he is loved and appreciated. So much of the year is spent with dear old Dad bringing home the bacon month after month with no real recognition of what that entails; it's nice he gets ONE day to spend with his offspring showing him they know what he does and that he does it for them.

About 4,000 years ago a young boy named Elmusu wished his Babylonian father good health and long life ... a "card" made of clay carries the impression of that message down through the ages to us. Now we continue the custom with cards, letters, phone calls and, yes, the tie!

The modern custom of setting aside one Sunday to honor fathers is attributed to two different women. Sonora Smart Dodd thought of it when she heard a Mother's Day sermon in 1909; she'd been raised by her widower father and was determined to set aside a day to honor him. Another woman, Grace Golden Clayton, is believed to have suggested the idea to her pastor after a mine explosion in Monongah, West Virginia, in 1908. In 1924, President Coolidge recommended that Father's Day become a national holiday;



in 1966, President Johnson designated the third Sunday of June as Father's Day, but not until President Nixon in 1972 did the holiday become "official."

No matter which woman gets credit for establishing the holiday, it is certain that the idea germinated out of love and gratitude from daughters who cherished their fathers.

Many of us at Sun City Shadow Hills missed our fathers for long periods of time. They were off "fighting a war" or had to travel for business. Were we not thrilled when they returned? Did your father teach you to ride a two-wheel bicycle? How to throw to first base? How to tie a bow-tie? How to drive? (And, did you both survive?) Did he give you good advice for living, for dating, for going on job interviews? Maybe your first job was working for him, or maybe you remember his "life" advice. When he opened the freezer on the refrigerator and found your brand-new angora sweater, did he leave it there when you explained that it would stay "fluffy" if kept cold? Did you wear his old dress shirts as swimsuit cover-ups?

And when he either escorted you up the aisle to be married, or watched you marry your bride, did you feel adult for the first time? It was amazing, wasn't it, how much he learned between your sixteenth year and your twenty-first. A man you may have thought was practically living in medieval times suddenly became someone you turned to for advice!

A father is indispensable in the most basic, fundamental sense; yet he can be physically absent and still loom over his children and their lives as an overwhelming presence. Many men and women at the end of their lives wonder if their father would be proud of them and what they made of themselves. They are always with us.

If your father is alive, how lucky you are; wear a red rose in his honor. If you honor the memory of a father who is gone, wear a white rose.

News About Indio

Hi again, Hillites!

Did you know Indio was the first municipality in the U.S. to offer biodegradable water bottles made entirely of natural materials? The bright green water bottles are given away at City-sponsored events.

Did you know that Indio was awarded the “Tree City USA” designation for the second year in a row? The program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service.

Here’s a follow-up on the City’s foreclosure acquisition rehabilitation and resale program. City officials were notified Indio was preapproved for \$2.8 million, which comes from the Federal Neighborhood Stabilization Program.

Indio’s City Council recently approved taking legal action against IID Energy for its failure to collect a utility users tax from residents on behalf of the City.

It is estimated that this oversight has cost Indio millions in lost revenue—money that pays for City services like fire and police, street improvements, etc. A comprehensive audit of IID’s tax collection methods and financial records was initiated to find out how long non-collection took place and how much revenue the City lost.

The City Council also initiated three other lawsuits:

- A claim against Verizon for its decision not to participate in funding the City’s downtown underground utility district.
- Two actions against CVWD; one for alleged noncompliance with a public records request, and another for a replenishment assessment charge increase.

Did you know we had a Women’s Club of Indio? The ladies are involved in some great activities. They recently awarded three scholarships: Nadia Gomez, age 31, became the first woman to receive the \$1,000 Empowering Women Through Education scholarship. Other recipients honored were Indio High School seniors Anna Acosta and Sandy Lopez, who each received a \$1,500 scholarship.

If you drive down Monroe Street near the new Indio Teen Center, you might be interested in viewing the 27-foot, 10,000-pound sculpture entitled One Voice that was installed outside the center.

The four-sided sculpture, which Phillip K. Smith III created with input from Indio teens, has vertical words cut out of steel in a graffiti font. It’s the first installed piece funded through the City’s Art in Public Places program.

The new high school at Jefferson and Ave 39, set to open in August, now has a name: Shadow Hills High School. The new middle school just west of the high school will select one of three names proposed: Desert Hills Academy, Desert Ridge Academy, or Desert Star Academy.

The new Terra Lago Fire Station No. 5, at Golf Center Parkway and Avenue 43, was officially dedicated in May. We now have two brand-new stations north of I-10. The new station houses two engines, a paramedic ambulance, and state-of-the-art equipment. On its first day in operation, the station responded to 15 calls. From April 24 – May 5, the fire station averaged eight calls daily.

Here’s another “did you know?”: the Coachella Valley Mounted Rangers, formerly known as the Indio Mounted Posse, has a 50-year lease on federal land northwest of Monroe Street between Avenues 38 and 40.

The nonprofit organization rescues and cares for neglected horses. The Rangers currently have 33 horses on their ranch; but the group lacks the funds to train the animals, build suitable stables, a well, and fencing. The clubhouse badly needs about \$25,000 worth of repairs. There is no electricity, and the ceiling needs insulation.

The group’s 16 members are responsible for maintaining the horses they own as well as cleaning their own stalls, and they are housed on the ranch. The club’s goal is to develop a 100-horse search-and-rescue unit that would assist valley cities and the Border Patrol, which has expressed interest. Construction of a 5-million-gallon reservoir above the Terra Lago Community in North Indio is scheduled to begin soon.

The Indio Water Authority awarded a \$5-plus million contract to build the Lost Horse Reservoir and Pipeline. Completion is slated for spring 2010. The reservoir will be the IWA’s first elevated, gravity-fed reservoir; it will not use a traditional water pump, thus saving money on utilities and energy. Lost Horse will go off the power grid with solar panels and a battery backup.

The tank will be elevated on a foothill. Natural rock outcroppings will surround the reservoir to retain the natural appearance of neighboring hillsides and slopes. Color will also be used that blends with the terrain.

Remember, buy in Indio – and drive safely!

the opportunity to choose a whole-house insulation upgrade that increases the "R-Value" which is a measure of thermal resistance used in the building and construction industry. The bigger the number, the better the building insulation's effectiveness will be. With this package the insulation will be increased in the HVAC ducts, walls and ceilings. This package also includes a Radiant Roof Barrier which is a material that is installed in buildings or homes to reduce summer heat gain. The potential benefit of attic radiant barriers is primarily in reducing air-conditioning cooling loads in warm or hot climates.

We will also install a Solar System Pre-wire if you choose the Solar Electric System either before construction or down the line in your new home. The A/C unit will also be upgraded from a 13 SEER unit to a 14 SEER unit. Also included in the package, the water heater that we are all familiar with will be replaced with a Tankless Water Heater which is the size of a small box that is mounted on the wall of your garage. To name a couple benefits, it will help you save energy and of course money. Isn't that great news?

- One quick flush of the toilet handle means only a half-tank flush for liquid.
- Hold flush handle down an extra second to get a full-tank flush.
- Your home has aerators on bathroom faucets.
- Turn water off when brushing teeth or shaving.
- Don't use the toilet as a wastebasket.

Sponsorships help the Association

At each of our Southern California communities, we are starting to see more active involvement by outside organizations and companies in our Lifestyle events and programs. This is a very good thing, and I wanted to take a moment to explain why.

At each Del Webb community, the Lifestyle Department has a budget allocated by the Association for Lifestyle operations like holding events, running programs, putting on parties and functions, conducting excursions, publishing the monthly newsletter, and all the other things the department does under the Lifestyle Director. As you can imagine, all of these activities cost money. The Lifestyle Directors are tasked with making almost everything they do “break even”. This ensures the Association operates within its approved budget.

It can be a big challenge mounting the very wide range of Lifestyle activities offered at our communities while also making them “break even.” So, while the community is still being developed, Del Webb invests additional funds in Lifestyle – outside the Association budget – to make these activities possible. Why do we do this? Because we believe an event or program may not be popular enough to “break even” but the residents who do want to participate should get the opportunity to do so.

As the community evolves to being built out, the Association needs to have a great foundation of sponsors and partnerships. 



Exercising in the Heat Safely

What you should do:

- Drink plenty of fluids. It's extremely important to stay hydrated. If you're thirsty then you are already dehydrated; drink before you feel a need to. Be sure to drink throughout the day (stick to non-caffeinated beverages, preferably water). Also, drink 15-20 minutes before beginning your workout and every 15 minutes throughout the exercise.
- Eat regularly. The heat can decrease your appetite, but it's important to eat normally. Try to eat small meals 5-6 times per day. Include lots of fruits and vegetables. Aside from being nutritious, fruits also tend to help with hydration.
- Wear light, loose-fitting clothes that breathe. Cotton is always good. If your activity produces a lot of perspiration, try clothing that wicks the sweat away.
- Wear sunscreen. Even if you exercise early in the morning or late in the evening, if the sun can reach you then you can get burned. Not only is a sunburn bad on the skin and potentially dangerous but it also hinders your body's ability to stay cool.
- Use common sense and don't attempt strenuous activities that your body is not accustomed to. Stick to exercises that you are very familiar and comfortable with.

What you should not do:

- Don't try to diet by sweating.
- Don't adopt the "no pain, no gain" motto. Ignoring your body's signals could be dangerous. Heat-related illnesses come with warning signs.
- Don't forget to drink plenty of liquid when swimming. As with any land exercises, you need to regularly replenish lost fluids when in the pool.
- Avoid physical activity during the hottest part of the day, which usually is between 10 am and 3 pm.
- Avoid extreme changes in temperature. Don't hop from being extremely hot and sweating right into an ice cold, air-conditioned environment. Try to cool your body down slightly before exposing it to the extreme temperature variation.

Golf Information

How to Grip (place your hands) on the Club

For Right Handed Golfers (left-handed players do opposite)

This is the most important technique to playing good golf... and anyone can do it!

Start by allowing your left arm to hang by your side while completely relaxed. Allow the Grip of your club to rest in the fingers of your left hand. Make sure the grip is in your fingers. Then simply close your left hand around the grip of the club. Next, lift the club-head by hinging your left wrist up. Use your left arm to bring the club out in front of you. The left hand should be slightly cupped and the left thumb should be positioned just to the right of the shaft centerline. The “V” created between your left forefinger and thumb should point to your right shoulder.

Then, to place your right hand on the club, just imagine you are placing your right hand on a pistol or handgun. Place your right hand over the left hand, while allowing your left thumb to fit inside the lifeline of your right hand. The “V” created by the right forefinger and thumb should also point to the right shoulder.

With both hands on the club, you should be able to hinge your wrists up and down.

This is a general guide to place your hands correctly on the club. As always, golf instruction can be very individual and there are always exceptions to basic techniques. Make sure you see your local PGA Professional for private one on one instruction, and you will be on your way to better, more enjoyable golf.



Security Update

Some Additional Thoughts on Crime Prevention

In looking at the census of our alarm clients, we find that many homeowners have never communicated with our central station despite our monthly pleadings for alarm testing. If a client never communicates with us, we have no knowledge of the condition of their alarm or even if they currently have a working alarm system. This advice is given sincerely and is applicable to any alarm system no matter the company or brand.

One of the best ways to test your system is to pretend you are a burglar. Follow these guidelines: Contact our central station 800 381 BOYD (2693). Properly identify yourself and let the operator know you are about to test the system. Arm your system and leave the premises. Make sure you allow enough time for the system to arm itself. Notify any concerned neighbors that you are about to test your alarm system. Now enter the home, open doors, walk test the system and activate the various sensors.

When satisfied, disarm the system, contact our central station again, and ask for the test results. Boyd & Associates should have received signals indicating what zones you have activated. When you are finished testing the system, notify our operator that you want to take the system off test.

Play the Security Game.

Before going on vacation, gather the family in the yard with the house properly locked up. Then try to get into the home without damaging it. If a window is left unlocked or the back door is easily pried, then you have discovered a vulnerability that the casual thief could exploit. If no one can gain access in six minutes then you are probably burglar-proofed. Every survey ever done with burglars reveals that somewhere after four to six minutes of futile trying they abandon their quest.

What is the difference between a burglary and a robbery?

If a thief stops you on the street and he threatens you with a gun or a knife, and because of that threat you give up your money, that is a robbery. Many times you may read in the paper that a robber simulated a gun or actually had a fake gun. It makes no difference. No one said robbers were smart. He may have had a mistaken belief that he could not be charged with armed robbery if he didn't have a real gun. Wrong!

If you arrive home to discover the back door kicked in and your belongings ransacked, that is a burglary. Most burglars are teenagers who live within a mile of your home, and generally you will find they have been in your home prior to the burglary. Burglars also come from the ranks of trades people or ex-employees such as maids or boyfriends of former domestics in your home.

Emergency Preparedness

At the monthly HOA Board meeting on April 27, 2009, the Board members voted unanimously to allocate the storage space room off the Mirada room as the Emergency Preparedness Committee Command and Communications Center. Previously this room was used as the employees' lunchroom and for the storage of chairs, cleaning supplies and machines. The EPC is forever grateful to the Board for the opportunity to use this space for their Command and Communications Center and for the storage of first aid and other emergency supplies.

Jack Neitlich is already at work with Anderson Communications who will install the repeater station which will allow the Zone Leaders to communicate with their radios with the Incident Commander in the Command Center and with each other from any distance within SCSH.

Locked cabinets will be installed to secure the communications equipment and emergency supplies. Air conditioning will be installed to keep the communications equipment at the proper temperature. Office furniture which Pulte donated earlier to the EPC will be moved in as soon as space is made available.

Although no agency is ever completely prepared to manage the chaos of a disaster, EPC now feels better equipped to handle the communications aspects and the other urgent issues incident to a disaster.

We may feel that living in a gated community means we don't have to worry about our security. And while our guards and patrols do a wonderful job, we are ultimately responsible for our own safety. Now that we're at the time of year when lots of us are leaving for longer periods, it is even more important for us to be aware of what we need to do to keep our homes safe.

The first things are probably obvious. Make sure all your doors and windows are locked and secure. And our Chief of Police recommends a security system, particularly if you are going to be away for months at a time. In addition, it is important you follow the recommendations of our customer relations staff regarding turning off your water – both for the house and for the refrigerator, but not your irrigation system; setting your air conditioner to the recommended 88 degrees; and turning your water heater pilot down to “vacation” or “pilot” while you are gone.

But even if you plan to be here all summer, it is still important to take some basic security precautions. Don't leave windows open or doors unlocked while you are away. And leaving your garage door open is an invitation to anyone passing by to walk in and help themselves to those golf clubs, tennis racquets and other stuff you're keeping in your garage.

A “Residential Security Survey” form provided by Indio Police Dept. is available on our website under Announcements. This is a great tool for owners who are leaving for the summer or just a week vacation.

We have also recently had a number of complaints that our security folks are giving tickets and not “warnings”. When you bought your house, you were given a copy of all the rules and regulations as part of the CC&R's. These are your “warnings”. The rules and regulations for Sun City Shadow Hills are not burdensome and are basically common sense – stop at the stop signs, observe the speed limits, don't create a nuisance. These are the same rules you'd have to follow in any community. And most important – treat our security folks the way you'd like to be treated – with respect and courtesy.
