



From the General Manager

Now that we have been through August of 2009 and re-experienced the summer of 1969 with our Woodstock Festival, we can begin to settle in and prepare for the beginning of our "Season." There are many activities planned for the upcoming year not only by the Lifestyle department but also by our many clubs. If you haven't already heard, this month is our Del Webb Music Festival. This will be a fun-filled day of music, food and other surprises. In October we will have a Film Festival and our Green Fair. In addition, Concerts 4 U, Community Singers, Performing Arts and the Lively Liners just to name a few will have some fun entertainment and activities planned for you. November kicks off with Freddie "Boom Boom" Cannon's rock and roll show and our performing arts show for the month will be *Twelve Angry Jurors*. While I have certainly left out some of the fun events that will be coming to our community as we move into fall, I think you can see from the few that I have mentioned that we will be kicking off our season with something for everyone. Stop by the Lifestyle desk and check to see what else we are planning for you.

Annual Meeting Update

The 2009 Annual Meeting of the Owners is scheduled for November 16, 2009. This year's meeting will be different from the 2008 meeting as we will have no vacancies on the Board. While there will not be an election for members to serve on the Board this year, it will still be important that everyone attend the meeting either in person or by proxy to approve the minutes from last year's meeting.

Last year the owners elected two homeowners to the Board, each to serve a two-year term that will expire at the annual meeting in 2010. Currently, the developer has not reached one of the trigger points at which there would be additional homeowner positions open on the Board. Currently the most likely scenario for triggering a change in the number of homeowner Board members would be at the annual meeting following the date when 75% of the lots on the Development's Tentative Subdivision Map have been sold. Two additional homeowner representatives will be added to the Board at this time, bringing the total number of homeowner Board members to four. At the same time, the Class "B" and "C" membership types will cease to exist. This means that the developer will only have one vote per unsold, annexed lot for each open position on the Board. The developer will continue to have the right to appoint one member of the Board until 90% of the lots in the Overall Development have been sold.

Next month I will provide more information on our upcoming November Annual Meeting.

Maintenance Updates

During the heat of July and August, we had some irrigation issues that caused our plants along the Boulevard and other common areas to become stressed. With a little extra attention and care from our landscape crew and monitoring by our maintenance staff, we were able to keep the shrubs and trees watered by using a small water truck. However, even with this additional care, we lost some plants. These will be removed, and replacement plants will be installed when the weather cools enough to allow the new plant material to get a good start.

Beginning approximately October 5 we will begin a slurry seal project on many of our streets and the parking lots at the Montecito Clubhouse and the Sales Center that will last three to four weeks. For those of you who have been through one of these street sealing projects before, I know you are aware of the temporary inconvenience that we will all experience. Before the start of the project the Maintenance department along with the asphalt company will put together letters and maps that will be sent out to the homeowners on the streets to be sealed along with the exact dates that we will need your cooperation. We will be posting the schedules on the in-house TV channel, the website and the community bulletin boards in addition to the letters that will go out to the individuals directly affected by work on their street. Please watch for possible date changes and more information in these locations.

Keeping Sun City Shadow Hills A Pleasant Place To Live

I want to thank all of our owners who have helped us notify the many vendors and personal service providers who were lining up at the Monroe exit gate to follow owners with transponders out of the property. This gate has been designated a transponder-only gate and was not intended for use by those who do not have a transponder. By your notifying your vendors and personal service providers – housekeepers, gardeners and pool service personnel – the problem has been greatly reduced. Thank you one and all.

During the summer we have experienced some of our guests who did not bring their guest card when using common area facilities such as the fitness center. Please remind your renters and guests that they must have the guest card with them and show it in order to use the facilities. A little reminder from you will help your guests have a more pleasant experience while visiting us at Sun City Shadow Hills.

Each of you should have received a mailing for comments on pending rule changes. Please remember to have any comments for the Board's consideration back to the Association office by September 4 so that the Board may review them in preparation for the September 14 Board meeting. (Please note that the original date of the September Board meeting has changed and will be held on Monday, September 14 at 2:00 pm.)

With These Hands

Celebrating Labor Day Featuring Two of Our Neighbors: A Union Steward and a Firefighter/Lobbyist

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes the yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity and well being of our country.

The first Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City by the members of the Central Labor Union. In the following years the Union encouraged other similar organizations to follow the example and celebrate a “workingman’s holiday” on the first Monday in September.

Governmental endorsement of the holiday received recognition by state legislation in 1887 when New York, Oregon, Massachusetts and New Jersey made it state law. By 1894 twenty-three other states adopted the holiday in honor of American workers.



In this spirit we introduce you to two of our community residents, Gloria Lash and Mike Cohen, who are representative of the American worker and have been actively involved in Labor Union activities throughout their working careers.

Gloria Lash joined Local 18 of the Operating Engineers, Columbus, Ohio, in 1984. She was one of

only a few women to work as a heavy equipment operator. She was self-taught in learning to operate heavy equipment. In 1980, in Ohio, she and her longtime companion, Steve Walls, began a business hooking up sewer lines for home owners who had abandoned their septic tanks. She learned to use a back hoe excavator to lay the sewer pipe to the main line in the street.

Gloria then moved on to operating other heavy equipment including bulldozers, bobcats, cranes and asphalt-rolling machines. She came to this type of work very naturally. As

a small girl, Gloria was always playing in the dirt and would help her father work under his car. She was always dirty or covered in auto grease and totally enjoyed the experience.

Gloria’s mother was embarrassed by her behavior, but her father was proud of her accomplishments. He always told her “can’t is not in your dictionary.” He was her inspiration.

An Army veteran, Gloria’s father was seriously wounded in WW II and lost an arm and a leg from his war injuries. However, it did not stop his determination to be active and productive. He could hang drywall with one arm, and he never complained.

During difficult times on the job, Gloria could often hear her dad’s words of encouragement; and this kept her going that extra mile. As a woman in a man’s field, she encountered a great deal of gender bias. Mostly it was economic. She would get fewer hours and shorter term jobs. Sometimes the men would attempt to sabotage her work, and slow her down, to make her look bad.


The men she worked with resented her being on the job. Therefore, Gloria says she had to be better than any man in her crew.

This strong-minded approach to her work earned Gloria the position of Union Steward, the interface between management and labor if a union member voiced a grievance against the employer. She would represent the union member between the two factions and often successfully mediated the situation.

In 2005, Gloria moved to the desert on a leap of faith. Construction in Ohio was slow, and the desert was booming with new construction. She joined Local 12 of the Operating Engineers and still drives heavy equipment for local employers.

Gloria has other talents. She is an accomplished organist who has played at dinner clubs and social events in Ohio. She also played a pipe organ in church.

She is very active in our Shadow Hills community as president of the “Concerts 4 U” club, which has brought such



entertainers to our stage as Freddie Cannon, The Oak Ridge Boys, Marco Mendez, and Bill Marx.

Gloria is a member and past president of the Performing Arts Club, played Norma in *Plaza Suite*, and is a member of the Community Singers. She has served on the Amenities Group. She also sculpts and paints.



Our second neighbor, Mike Cohen, has a very different profile and had an interesting career in three different jobs: as an electrician, a firefighter, and a lobbyist.

He was born in Chicago and began his career as an apprentice electrician in 1960, becoming a journeyman electrician in 1964. Mike worked

on major commercial construction projects, including steel mills and the famous Chicago skyscraper, the John Hancock Tower.

Previously, he served as a volunteer fire fighter for the community of Glenview, Illinois and always had a strong desire to become a full-time fire fighter.

In 1969 the opportunity arose. The City of Chicago Fire Department tested for new fire fighters only every 5-6 years. At age 30, the cut-off age, Mike applied and was accepted.

He took a substantial pay cut to become a fire fighter, but this was his lifelong ambition. His wife of 47 years, Sheila, thought he was crazy at the time; but for Mike it was realizing his childhood dream.

He had a distinguished career as a fire fighter and ultimately was promoted to lieutenant in charge of a six man hook and ladder unit. When Mike retired, he received many honors including recognition by Chicago Mayor Richard M. Daley.

In a personal letter to Mike, the Mayor said: "For 20 years, you dedicated your life to helping your fellow man... You should be commended for a yeoman job well done. Your tireless service to the citizens of Chicago has been and will always be appreciated." A framed copy of Mayor Daley's letter is prominently displayed in Mike's home office.

For much of his fire fighting career Mike was assigned to a rescue squad whose job was to respond to any emergency where a victim was pinned in the wreckage. They were the first squad to be supplied with the Jaws of Life, a device that pries open damaged doorways and other metal obstructions.

The squad responded to approximately 6,800 emergency

calls per year. Mike says his worst experience was in 1979 when he responded to a train collision where a commuter train rear ended another train, and 40 people were killed.

Mike became active in the fire fighters union in 1980. Chicago fire fighters had no employment contract with the city and were requesting a collective bargaining agreement to receive better pay, better disability benefits, and better retirement compensation. The city refused to bargain and the union went out on strike. It lasted 21 days.

During that time, Mike helped out in the union office, fielding phone calls, doing paper work and anything to be of assistance. He became the union office controller and then was elected Director of Political Action for the Firefighters Union. For the next nine years he still worked as an active fire fighter and was given time off to work as the union lobbyist in Springfield, the Illinois capital. As a lobbyist Mike spoke for the union and obtained legislative changes on behalf of the fire fighters.

Ultimately Mike was successful in obtaining better benefits for the union members and established collective bargaining for all fire fighters in the state.

He then founded his own lobbying firm and represented various state pension funds, The Illinois Bankers Association, and a variety of other businesses as diverse as locksmiths and pawn brokers.

Mike retired from his lobbying firm in 2008 and moved to Shadow Hills from Chicago.

Mike is active in our community serving as chairman of two committees: the Neighborhood Watch Committee and the Security Committee. With his background as a fire fighter, he feels extremely well qualified to represent the community in safety and security issues.

Mike and Gloria represent only two of the many residents here who have made a contribution to this country through their hard work. This Labor Day let's all take some time to acknowledge all those in the workplace who toil daily to create so much of the nation's strength, freedom and leadership—the American Worker!

It was 1978 when a piano competition began at College of the Desert under the guidance of talented local pianist Joanna Hodges. In 2001, the competition was named "The Virginia Waring International Piano Competition"; and Virginia Waring (a graduate of the Music Academy at Fountainebleau, France, and the wife of orchestra leader Fred Waring) took over the helm. After appearing regularly on television's "The Fred Waring Show," Virginia and Fred were instrumental in the development of a great many of the cultural resources here in our desert, such as The McCallum Theater.

This piano competition has grown in popularity over the years, and every two years talented musicians come from all over the world to contest for outstanding prizes and honors. Last year pianists in the oldest category were represented. In the spring of 2011, children twelve and under will compete; and those thirteen to seventeen will

also participate. Most will be housed with local residents, and volunteers will provide the transportation to and from the colleges where they will compete. It's a huge endeavor to organize and coordinate all of the activities and final shows.

Volunteers are always needed to offer clerical help, usher, man the box office, furnish transportation and organizational skills, and (most important) to provide housing – preferably with pianos in the home where contestants can practice. Sun City Shadow Hills residents who helped this past year were Karen Dougherty, Mara Kuchinski, and Carol DeRossett.

The rewards of being a volunteer with this organization are many. If you provide housing, you have the joy of being able to listen to very skilled musicians practice (most, for six to eight hours a day). It's so interesting to meet and become friends with people from other countries and other cultures. Volunteers also get to attend the competitions and final award shows. Competition Associates pay \$45 and get these benefits.

An outreach program has more recently been developed. Through this initiative, past winners will be brought to play at schools and senior centers.

News About Indio

Hi again, Hillites! Welcome back to those who have returned early.

The City of Indio Historic Preservation Commission is in the process of creating an eighth mural on the wall outside Johnson's Old Town Photo Shop at 82 789 Miles Avenue. The store dates back to the 1950s and is one of the few remaining independently owned and family-run businesses in our valley.

Seven murals have been completed since April 1997, when the Indio Chamber of Commerce started the program to stimulate development and interest in Old Town. The City took over the reins in 2006. The proposed new mural will feature a collage of historic photos of Old Town Indio; it will be 70 feet long and 18 feet tall. The project will cost approximately \$50,000, paid for by the City's public arts fund that is supported by contributions from developers.

Where are the Old Town Indio murals? I'll give you a hint. Let's see how many Hillites find all seven plus Johnson's Photo Shop:

- Indio Boulevard and Sun Gold Street (2).
- Indio Boulevard and Towne Street.
- Miles Avenue and Oasis Street.
- Civic Center Drive and Fargo Street.
- Towne Street and Miles Avenue.
- Fargo Street and Indio Boulevard.

A plan has been approved by the City Planning Commission to designate approximately 98 miles of trails throughout Indio. The plan recommends adding 72 miles of new bike lanes, 13.7 miles of earthen multi-use trails, and 6.5 miles of paved trails to the City's current 20.3 miles. The City is expected to look at several funding sources for the project, including state and Federal programs as well as partnerships with nearby cities like La Quinta and Coachella.

On June 18, 2009, Indio City Manager Glenn Southard received the Jack Phillips Award for 2009. The honor is named after a former industry councilman and was presented by the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments.

The Coachella Valley Museum and Cultural Center, at 82-616 Miles Avenue in Indio, is looking for local community organizations to join in an international cultural festival for next year's heritage day program on March 27, 2010. Call 760-342-6651 for information.

The Indio Planning Commission is considering granting a permit to build a 29,000 square foot, single-story special surgery hospital with 12 overnight stay beds on a 2.25-acre property at the northwest corner of Avenue 44 and Golf Center Parkway. The Joint Replacement Hospitals of America plans to build the facility within the next two years.

Our state-of-the-art Indio Teen Center is offering free recreational services and athletic classes to all high school students in the valley. The most popular class is the boxing program taught by standout local amateur Gabino Saenz. Kids from the Teen Center are taken to the boxing gym at the Indio Boys and Girls Club. Also popular is Tai Kwon Do; uniforms and an instructor are provided free of charge. Youth under 18 years of age make up about 35 percent of our City's population.

The Indio City Council has approved agreements with four unions that represent 97 percent of all City employees. Employees have agreed to forgo cost-of-living and merit pay raises for two years in order to help the City through current troubled economic times. The agreements will save the City \$2.3 million. The unions involved are the Indio Police Officers Association, the Laborers International Union of North America, the Police Command Unit, and the Service Employees International Union.

Indio is gaining a reputation for great government. Recently the City received an award for its "Make a Difference Day" home makeover program from the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment. Now Indio has been nominated as a finalist for the National League of Cities Award for municipal excellence because of the City's foreclosure mitigation program. Winners will be announced in November.

That's all, folks. Stay cool, hydrate, drive safely, and shop in Indio.

Does it seem like it has been warm lately? Just think, some people go to spas and pay to sweat like this! Thank goodness for air conditioning.

Since we live in a climate with extreme temperatures part of the year, it is important to have your air conditioner serviced. Just like your car, your heating and air conditioning system requires maintenance.

You should have an agreement with a licensed heating and air conditioning contractor to come and service your units twice a year. This service can potentially detect problems before they occur to avoid possible issues in the future. This type of preventative maintenance is no different from having your car serviced, which can potentially extend the life of your units. It is cheap insurance to have someone inspect your system to make sure it is running as correctly and efficiently as possible.

Covenants Committee

A lot of us are having visitors these days and, due to the economy, some of us have turned into landlords instead of sellers. But we all need to understand that our rules apply just as much to tenants, friends, grandchildren, etc. as they do to the homeowners in the community – that means the speed limits, stop signs, etc.

The speed limits are the same whether you are visiting, renting, or own a home here. And the stop signs mean “stop” for everyone – not just residents.

For everyone’s safety, people riding bikes need to stay in the bike lanes or on the far right when there are no bike lanes. Too often, we’re seeing folks ride two and three abreast down the middle of the street. This is particularly true when families are riding together. But it would be horrible to have a vacation spoiled by a visit to the emergency room – or worse.

In this heat, it’s very tempting to want to bring the kids here for a dip in the pool. But our pools do not have a lifeguard on

duty at any time so it’s important that we pay attention to the rules in order to keep everyone safe. Children under 18 years old are not allowed in the indoor pool at any time. And for safety reasons children under age 17 must be accompanied by an adult resident or adult guest with a valid guest ID card when using the outdoor pool. Further, children between age four and 16 are only allowed in the outdoor pool between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. After 3:00 p.m., it’s adults only in the outdoor pool and always adults only in the indoor pool.

Children under 12 are not allowed in the billiard room at all. Children between 12 and 16 must be supervised by an adult resident or adult guest with a valid Guest ID card during the entire time they are in the billiard room.

Children under the age of 16 are not allowed in the reading room unless supervised for the entire time they are there by an adult resident or adult guest with a valid Guest ID card.

Residents are responsible for any damage caused by their tenants or guests – both adults and children. But if we all just use common sense and treat the common areas – the pool, spa, clubhouse, etc. – the same way we’d want folks to treat our homes, there won’t be any problems.

DRC Committee

Driveway/Walkway Stains

Article VI Section 6.03 in your Design Review Guidelines states: Stains on concrete driveways and walkways must be removed when excessive amounts of rust, oil or other stains are visible as determined by the Design Review Committee.

If you remove the stains yourself, wear rubber gloves and eye protection. Pick up the water and stain solution with old rags or a wet/dry vacuum. Don’t allow the solution to run down your street gutter.

My driveway had three small stains that I removed with CLR (Calcium, Lime and Rust remover) and a steel brush. Wash the area when you finish. Don’t wait too long, as the rust seems to find other places to stick if it isn’t removed quickly and thoroughly. If you have a lot of stains on your driveway and/or walkways, you may want to hire someone to professionally do it, as it can be a lot of work and frustrating.

Oil and grease stains are probably best handled with dish washing detergent, as it will break them up and you can wash them away. I have been told that with this technique you will still be able to see the stain where it was absorbed into the concrete. Using a steel brush while doing this may help get more of the oil and grease out of the stain. Try using water and a steel brush to remove golf cart battery stains.

All of these techniques require a lot of hard work to remove the stain!
