Have you driven on Sun City Boulevard or residential streets and noticed a white standing contraption that reads your speed and wondered what it is or why it's here at Sun City? It is our speed minder that Security has been using to slow people down. It monitors your speed for approximately 40 to 50 feet as you drive past it.

The speed minder allows Security to document traffic count, highest speed, and the number of violators who went over the speed limit.

Security started using the speed minder in April. There were over 70 citations/warnings issued. The number of violators has decreased substantially since April. It has been very effective in slowing down residents, guests and vendors. So, remember to slow down and watch for pedestrians, bikes and golf carts so we will all have a safe summer.

Design Review (DRC)

Irrigation

With the heat finally here, it's time to check your irrigation system's operation. If your system is having problems, you will find out quickly by looking at your plants. My wife and I just returned from a vacation to find that two new plants we had just planted were dead. Three other plants were struggling, but the rest of the established plants were OK. For some reason, the front yard irrigation was not working.

Since the most recently installed plants have the smallest root system, these plants will be the first ones to show the effects of inadequate water in hot weather. Plants that have been in your landscape for five years are well established, having a root system that is one to one-and-a-half times the size of their canopy. The root system is also down into the soil, so it has a large area in which to acquire its water.

The best way to check the amount of water your plants are receiving is to check the wetness of the soil around the plants. If the soil is dry after your system has just run, the plants are not getting enough water and you may need to increase your station run time; also check that the emitters are not clogged and creating the problem. If the soil is very wet, the station may be running too long. Your stations should be running for about 15 minutes two times a day during July. Check your soil!

Street Lights

Report streetlight repairs to the HOA Office. The HOA Office will report them to the Facilities Maintenance Department so that they can be repaired. Streetlights that need bulb replacement or repairs will be reported to Imperial Irrigation District. Streetlights are inspected monthly by the Facilities Maintenance Department.

Summer Heat

The summer months upon us with temperatures of 100 degrees plus, keep in mind the pool water temperature can get up to 90 degrees. It is normal for pools in the desert to get hot due to hot ambient temperatures. The pools at the Fitness center are not cooled, so as the hot weather rises the pool water gets hot. During the summer months, we turn off the heaters to the outdoor pool. The indoor pool air temperature is climate controlled and is maintained at 86 degrees and the pool water is maintained at 86 degrees.

Street Sweeping Schedule

The homeowners association is responsible for street sweeping of the HOA tracts. The tracts are being swept on Thursdays and Fridays. The Montecito Clubhouse Parking Lot and Sun City Boulevard from the main gate to 40th Avenue will be swept on Fridays and Mondays. Streets from the Jefferson gate to the American Canal will be swept on Thursdays. Streets from the American Canal to 40th Street will be swept on Fridays. Construction areas will be swept by Pulte/Del Webb Construction.

Tip of the Month

Operation of gates and arm barriers on Monroe and 40th exits

When exiting through the gates, the gates open when a vehicle has approached approximately 30 feet from the gate. The sensor that has been installed on the street will then energize the gate to open. There is a second sensor past the gate and this will hold the gate open until the vehicle has cleared the gate passage. Keep in mind that the operation cycle is designed for one vehicle to go through at a time.

When entering the property through Monroe and 40th streets, here you have an arm barrier and gate. When the vehicle approaches the gate, the sensor will energize the arm barrier and gate to open. As soon as the vehicle clears the arm barrier, it will close. This is designed so only one vehicle goes through at a time for security reasons. For example, say you as a resident are coming through the gate and a vehicle following you does not have a transponder. The gate will close not letting that vehicle behind you enter the property.

When entering the property on Monroe and 40th streets, we are having some issues with vehicles following each other and not allowing the gates to complete the opening and closing cycle. The arm barrier is closing on vehicles. To remedy this problem, we have installed a speed bump on Monroe. This will slow the vehicles and allow the arm to close and restart a new opening cycle without closing down on the vehicles.



The Del Webb Brand – 50 Years of Leadership and Loyalty

The year 2010 marks the 50th anniversary of the Del Webb brand. For half a century the name Del Webb has been synonymous with active adult living.

When you think about it, 50 years is a long time for a company to spend defining its industry. For instance, how long has Starbucks been

around? Yes, they have stores everywhere, but how long have they been as prevalent as they are today? What about Wal-Mart? Generally speaking, most Americans had never even heard of Starbucks or Wal-Mart until the 1990s.

Not so with Del Webb. In fact, a research study performed in the

1980s showed that Del Webb was the only nationally recognized brand name in America for new home builders.

Why? Some of this had to do with Mr. Webb himself. He was, unquestionably, the first famous builder in America. Sort of a less-flashy version of Donald Trump for his time. He was not only part-owner of the Yankees during their golden age, but he also helped build the Pentagon and Madison Square Garden. Not to mention the first casino in Las Vegas. (Go watch the Warren Beatty movie “Bugsy.” Ned Beatty plays Del Webb. The movie got some of its props from the Del Webb company archives.)

More to the point, Del Webb became famous primarily because the company built a certain type of community and designed these communities better than anyone else. Communities for people who were at or near retirement and wanted to enjoy an active, healthy lifestyle.

The original Sun City, just outside Phoenix, opened on January 1, 1960. More than 100,000 people toured the models during those first few days, and more than 400 homes were sold. That was the original Sun City, and it was 13,000 acres. It had homes, golf courses, recreational facilities and shopping centers where residents could buy groceries, get their hair done, etc. It was a model based on necessity; it needed to provide these services because otherwise residents would have to drive an hour into Phoenix.

For the next several years, Del Webb completed the original Sun City, and in 1978, work began on its replacement, Sun City West, on land directly adjacent to the original community. The architecture and building systems were more contemporary, but the community plan was the same – homes, golf, recreation, retail.

In the late 1980s, the company realized it could never truly grow if it depended solely on people moving to Arizona. Following a test with a small community in Tucson, it expanded beyond Arizona's borders, opening Sun City Las Vegas in 1987. The results were dramatic. Sun City Las Vegas sold over 1,000 homes the first year.

The company attempted to repeat this success in California, opening Sun City Palm Desert in 1992, as well as another Sun City in the Sacramento area a

few years later. Unfortunately, California was in the worst recession in 60 years as the time, and sales were not as expected.

Unbowed by economic challenges, the company opened communities across America in places like Hilton Head, South Carolina, Georgetown (near Austin) Texas, and Huntley (near Chicago) Illinois. All these communities were successful, but never to the degree Sun City Las Vegas had been. For years, the company benefited from the exponential growth of Las Vegas, successfully completing four communities there. But that success wasn't enough to keep the company thriving.

By 2001, many other larger national builders had realized the benefit of what Del Webb was doing, and how it met the needs of the active adult demographic of America. After avoiding a takeover attempt by Shea Homes, Del Webb merged

with Pulte Homes, a company it knew understood its mission and the value of its brand. It made perfect sense.

With the resources of Pulte behind it, Del Webb soon expanded across America; not just with a large community here for there, but with many communities almost everywhere.

Today, as we celebrate 50 years of industry leadership and home buyer loyalty, you no longer need to move to Arizona to enjoy the Del Webb lifestyle. In Your Backyard... Roadrunners

If you see a large, strange, streaked-colored bird run through your yard, and then fly up onto your wall, it very well may be our Greater Roadrunner. This bird has long legs and a long tail with a blue and red streak behind his eye. Usually you'll find this bird on the ground where he pecks away at insects, small rodents, and the eggs and young of other small birds. He'll even consume a small snake or two, but probably his most favorite meal is a nice fat lizard for lunch.

The Roadrunner is what we call a "scavenger." He will be delighted to pick up your droppings from your picnic; but just about the time you begin to associate him with the cute bird in the cartoon, I have to tell you that he just loves to eat road-kill. He will even eat rattlesnakes and fruit; he is not too picky.

When the road-runner sees you coming, he will often raise his crest and tail. He's amusing to watch; he'll fly short distances up or down from a wall. For example: let him get going and he will run 15 miles per hour pursuing a lizard or insects.

Many roadrunners live in our Coachella Valley, but they also live in the wooded forests, in the brush or in grasslands, and any area that is arid in the southern part of North America. They build a sort of platform nest of sticks, and then they line it with roots, feathers, grasses, snake skins, mesquite pods, and dried horse or cattle manure. The nest is built in low cactus, tree or bush, usually three to 15 feet high.

A roadrunner will lay four to six yellowish-white eggs every 17-20 days. They live in pairs and stay on their territory. If you hear a dove-like coo that descends in pitch, it may be your local roadrunner. Once while working as a docent at The Living Desert, I saw a roadrunner follow a golf cart that was carrying food for the caged birds. When the driver stopped and went into a cage, the roadrunner hopped on the back of the cart where the food was; he immediately began pecking the bag open and helping himself to as much as he could until discovered by the worker. I got the impression that he had done this before, so he's not just a scavenger but a bit of a thief, too.

Do you need a break from the heat? Do triple digits keep you indoors? An oasis is just minutes away from your door: welcome to the Montecito Clubhouse!

Reflections on America's 234th Birthday In the Words of The Founders

On July 4th, we will again celebrate what our grade school teachers taught us is “America’s birthday.” Sometimes, though, the modern-day torrent of barbecues, parades, and fireworks seems to overshadow what we are really commemorating: the courageous decision by delegates to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia in 1776, after more than a year of war with Great Britain, to inaugurate what may be history’s boldest social experiment.

The announcement of this decision came in the form of the Declaration of Independence. Its main drafter was Thomas Jefferson, a wealthy lawyer turned politician from Virginia whose family was among the earliest emigrants from England.

After initially voting for independence on July 2nd, the Congress delegates heatedly debated Jefferson’s draft for two days. Many understandably still felt a kinship to England. Eventually, about a quarter of the draft was deleted including a passage critical of the slave trade, changes that Jefferson deeply resented.

Fifty-six delegates, all from the colonial elite like Jefferson, eventually signed the Declaration – not on July 4th, when the Congress approved its final wording, but on August 2nd in order to allow time for those delegates who were away on business to travel to Philadelphia. Among the signers were two future presidents (Jefferson and John Adams). The youngest signer was 26 (Edward Rutledge of South Carolina) and the oldest was 70 (Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania).

Reflections on America's 234th Birthday In the Words of The Founders

As we all know, the most famous autograph on the document is by John Hancock of Massachusetts, President of the Congress and one of the wealthiest men in the Colonies at the time. Hancock, who probably signed first, wrote his name flamboyantly, allegedly declaring (although this assertion did not surface until many years later):

"There, I guess King George will be able to read that without his spectacles!"

After signature, the Declaration was then issued in several forms, most prominently in a printed broadside – a large poster that did not include the delegates' signatures – that was distributed widely and read to the public.

Once it served its purpose of announcing and justifying the independence of the Colonies, though, the Declaration was largely ignored in the years immediately after the Revolution. Its language was not incorporated into our country's new constitution. Ironically, the Declaration's second sentence has since become one of the most famous statements in the English language:

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

Various unverifiable legends about the signing emerged after the Declaration eventually became an important national symbol some 50 years after its publication. One such story asserts that Hancock, after penning his name, exhorted the delegates that "we must all hang together" – to which Franklin famously replied (although this quotation did not appear in print until more than 50 years after Franklin's death):

We must all hang together, or assuredly we shall all hang separately.

The philosophical roots of the Declaration have been the subject of much scholarly debate, and its words seem influenced by a wide range of European political theory from the 16th through the 18th centuries. Jefferson himself declared that the Declaration contained "no original ideas" but was a statement of ideals widely shared by supporters of the Revolution.

Whatever the document's origins, The Founders were consistent in proclaiming the existence of a "natural law" that guarantees basic human rights – despite this seeming paradox with the existence of slavery in America. The delegates were also widely suspicious of government, whose influence they sought to limit in everyday life:

What is government itself but the greatest of all reflections on human nature?

*If men were angels,
no government would be necessary.*

*If angels were to govern men,
neither external nor internal controls
on government would be necessary.*

*In framing a government which is to be
administered by men over men, the great
difficulty lies in this: you must first enable
the government to control the governed; and
in the next place oblige it to control itself.*

— James Madison

*A government is like fire, a handy servant,
but a dangerous master.*

— George Washington

What a testimony to the wisdom of The Founders that debate continues until this very day about the rights of the individual as measured against the power of government!


Returning to our clubhouse after knocking our collective socks off last year, the Blue Breeze Band will bring





Pool Enjoyment

Summer is here! As it heats up, the pools will become more popular and the place to be. Please help us maintain the quality and enjoyment of our pool areas for all by adhering to the following:

- Single-person floating devices can be used only in the Outdoor Pool through August 31 on weekdays, no holidays and not when the pool is crowded.
- Children ages 4–17 are allowed only in the Outdoor Pool between the hours of 10 am – 3 pm.
- Children under the age of 14 are not permitted in any Jacuzzi at any time.
- Incontinent persons of any age are not allowed to use the pools or Jacuzzis at any time. Diapers of any type are not permitted.
- Balls and toys are not permitted.
- Absolutely no diving is allowed.
- Running, jumping, and hanging/sitting/climbing on hand rails or lane dividers is not permitted.
- Loud or erratic behavior is not permitted.
- All persons are required to shower before entering the pool and after use of any suntan lotion prior to re-entering the pool. Suntan oil is not permitted.
- Only proper swimming attire is permitted. Cut-offs, underwear or street clothing may not be worn in the pools.
- No bandages of any type may be worn in the pools.
- No pets are allowed within fenced pool areas except for permissible reasonable accommodation.
- Food, canned beverages or plastic cups may be used in the sun lounge area and those areas provided with tables. No food or drinks are allowed in the pools or within four feet of the water.
- Smoking is not permitted in the pool areas.
- Users of the pools are expected to maintain reasonable decorum, be considerate of others and observe all safety rules.

If you have guests that will be using the pool areas, we ask that you please have them register at the Fitness Center desk prior to entering the pool area.

Fitness Tip

When should I increase the weight I am lifting?

Gradually increasing the amount of weight you use is crucial for building strength. When you are able to lift a weight between 12 to 15 times for 2 to 3 sets with no problem, you can increase the amount of weight you use at your next session. Here is an example of how to progress gradually: Start out with a weight that you can lift 8 to 10 times for 1 to 2 sets. Keep using that weight until you become strong enough to lift it 12 to 15 times for 2 to 3 sets with ease. Add more weight so that, again, you can lift it only 8 to 10 times for 1 to 2 sets. Again use this weight until you can lift it 12 to 15 times for 2 to 3 sets, then add more weight. Keep repeating.






during the month as you wish, and snowbirds need only pay for the months they are here.
