Speed Kills! Don't Let it Happen Here

Speeding is one of the greatest contributors to auto accidents. It is a factor in about one-third of all fatal crashes, killing more than 1,000 Americans every month.

In 2008, speed killed 11,674 people nationally. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) estimates that the economic cost of speed-related crashes is more than \$40 billion each year. That's a high price to pay in lives and dollars for not obeying the speed limit.

We all know the faster a driver speeds, the greater the risk of an auto accident. Then why do so many of us speed? And why do we ignore the speed limits in our own community? This article is our attempt to make us all more aware of our driving

habits and the consequences that can occur if we continue to speed.

Last fall, *The View* published an article on speeding and urged drivers to slow down. Although we live in a gated community and many of our streets are residential side streets (with a few exceptions like Sun City Boulevard), we still have too many speeders. The article published results from 12 weeks of speed monitor assessment on Sun City Boulevard and found that, out of 6,532 vehicles monitored, 31% exceeded the posted speed limit — with the highest speed clocked at 61 mph.

In spite of pleas to slow down — including issuing warnings and citations — there remain too many speeders on our streets. For example, our speed minder monitored cars on several of our streets over the last three months and recorded the following:

- With 3,993 cars monitored on all streets surveyed in April, there were 993 violators or 25%.
- On April 6, out of 372 cars monitored on Camino Los Milagros, there were 181 violators or 48%.
- There were 239 speeders recorded in May out of 833 monitored, or 29%.
- On June 8 on Avenida Sombra, 39% of all cars monitored were speeding with the highest speed clocked at 18 miles over the limit.
- The highest violation percentage

occurred on Camino Los Milagros, where 49% of cars monitored were speeding.

Have we forgotten that speed limits are intended to protect drivers and pedestrians from accidents that can occur when a car is driving too fast? Or are we just not aware of the consequences?

The NHTSA conducted a study on the driving public's attitudes and behaviors about speeding and published these results:

- Three-quarters of drivers in the survey reported they drove over the speed limit on all types of roads within the past month.
- Six in ten drivers age 65 or older report speeding on all road types.
- Males were 50 percent more likely than females to speed.
- Of those age 65 or older, 86% felt that other drivers' speeding is a major threat to their own personal safety.

Speed-related accidents can be prevented if we simply follow the designated speed limits in our community. *The View* is once again asking each one of you to remember to slow down, drive responsibly, and always obey the posted speed limit. Pass this word on to all your friends, family, guests, and those that provide services to your home. If we can all adhere to these simple rules, Sun City Shadow Hills will indeed be a safer place for all of us.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION AT SCSH

In order to keep track of vehicles legally in the SCSH community, owners are required to register their vehicles with the HOA. All registered cars are then issued a transponder, which allows them easy entry into and out of the community. It also allows Security to identify persons illegally using a homeowner's vehicle. When trading or selling your current vehicle, it is important

that the transponder be returned to the HOA. In the event you transfer the transponder to a new vehicle, it is important that you notify our HOA with the information about your new vehicle. Transponders indicating a different vehicle are subject to being stopped and investigated as well as becoming a potential security risk for the community. Please make sure your vehicle is properly registered – it's for your safety.

In Your Backyard...

The Desert Tortoise

Did you know that you must have a license to keep a desert tortoise at your home? That's because the desert tortoise, or land turtle, has been declared an endangered species. In years past it was not unusual for desert travelers to stop on our California highways and pick up a tortoise crossing the highway. The rationale was that the tortoise would probably get run over since it moved so slowly, so many tortoises were taken home to become a pet for the kids.

Tortoises are land-dwelling turtles, marine cousins of sea turtles. They are protected from their predators by their thick shells made of keratin, the same substance from which our fingernails are made. Tortoises can have webbed feet, but sea turtles are distinguished by their flippers.

Like other reptiles, tortoises lay eggs for reproduction. The female digs a nesting burrow and lays from one to 30 eggs, usually at night. She covers the eggs with sand, soil, or other organic material and leaves them to hatch, which takes 60 to 120 days. Hatchlings are born in an

egg sac that serves as a source of nutrition until they have the mobility to find their own food. Their life spans are comparable to humans, depending on the availability of food. One tortoise that was given by Captain Cook to a royal family was said to have lived 188 years.

The tortoise has a large bladder as an adaptation to our desert heat. If a traveler stops to pick up this creature to help it to the other side of the road, chances are it will void its bladder on being picked up, which can be a death sentence since then it won't have enough fluid to maintain it in the hot weather.

Tortoises are herbivores but in captivity eat lettuce, carrots, and even fruit like watermelon. Their skeletons are actually attached to their shells. They are reclusive in nature and vary greatly in size from a few centimeters to two meters.

The tortoise is probably best remembered by the story of *The Tortoise and the Hare*, but he has also served an important place in superstitious beliefs of ancient societies. He's fun to watch and never ceases to entertain those around him.



Choice or Accident

Alexander Hamilton wrote to the people of New York on October 27, 1787, as part of the Federalist Papers: "It has been frequently remarked, that it seems to have been reserved to the people of this country, by their conduct and example, to decide the important question, whether societies of men are really capable or not, of establishing good government from reflection or choice, or whether they are forever destined to depend, for their political constitutions, on accident and force."

On February 7, 2011, the residents of Sun City Shadow Hills will be invited to a General Association Meeting with the express purpose of electing the next Association Board of Directors. What makes this election unique is that control of the Board will pass to the residents of Shadow Hills. The current Board consists of three members appointed by the contractor, Pulte (Board President, Vice President, and Treasurer), and two resident-elected members. The new Board will consist of four resident-elected members and one Pulte-appointed member.

What does this mean for the residents? We will have control of Shadow Hills' future.

Much will happen between now and February 7.

A Nominating Committee will be appointed to review all prospective candidates to make sure they are qualified to sit on the Board. Residents interested in seeking a seat will have to file an application with the Association and, after review, a slate of candidates will be published to the community. The Association will hold a "Candidates Forum" so the residents can hear from each candidate, and The View magazine will have a section about each candidate in the January issue. Formal ballots will be mailed out to each resident from a company, Ballot Box, which was hired to run the election for the Association. Ballot Box will establish a website that will contain all election information and the election results, just in case you are unable to attend the General Meeting. See the associated Ballot Box website for the evolving schedule.

The Association needs at least eight candidates, two for each resident position open. At the election, each resident will have four votes to cast. The top two vote-getters will serve a two-year term on the Board, and the next two vote-getters will serve one-year terms. This will stagger the Board terms after this first election.

As Alexander Hamilton pointed out above, will it be "choice" or "accident" that will elect our new Board? If we do not become knowledgeable about each candidate, and vote for the candidates that support the best interests of the community as a whole, we will have a Board by accident.

Come to the Forum, read *The View* article and, above all, vote!

One gathering that Robert and I treasure is our weekly Catholic bible study group, sharing our basic beliefs yet having an open discussion ripe with our differences that span the spectrum from pre-Vatican II practices and dogma to advocating married and women priests. I believe in my church's social justice positions, yet I call myself a Catholic "with footnotes." I want my Church honoring women more honestly, confronting life as it is today more compassionately

especially on the issues of divorce, abortion, birth control, and homosexuality, and not simply protecting and defending the Church of the Middle Ages on these issues. Knowing that I am free to express my differences while still being respected and loved is quite comforting. In our two years as a group, we have persistently worked at accepting those who differ with us and have grown in our love and appreciation of each other.

What lies ahead? I'm not sure that's so important to me at this mature stage of my life. Days will come when my HQ is low. Now, I focus on living in the present, taking time to more deeply appreciate the moment as it is and not how I wish it to be. My life's work now is to explore the depths of my unknowns, discovering new experiences, cherishing my friendships, studying new subjects, and traveling to places I have never been.

Sun City Shadow Hills is providing the perfect atmosphere for this exploration.





Speaking of happy, Darryl always has a smile on his face; has a deep, throaty laugh; loves making friends; and is a member of the "Red Friday

Gym Rats" at our Fitness Center. Teased often about talking more than exercising, he works out almost daily. As soon as he arrives in the gym, people tend to congregate around him, having conversations about spouses, children, health, and rumors — in other words, Darryl is a fountain of other people's information. If you still have the July issue of *The View*, check out the photo of Darryl and his fellow gym rats. He's the one with the curly hair.

Darryl is also the "Wikipedia" of musical information. He knows names of singers and bands, their labels, the backside of their recordings (when there were backsides), their standing

on the Hit Parade, and so much more. People love to trick him with musical trivia, but to no avail.

If you're at the clubhouse, you'll see Darryl walking, or sometimes running, around. Because of his passion for music and theater, he's totally committed to the Performing Arts Club, the Concerts 4 U Club, Sir Laffs-a-Lot, and most anything theatrical. Currently he serves as President of Concerns 4 U, is the MC for all Sir Laffs-a-Lot shows, and is rehearsing his upcoming role in *Light up the Sky* for Performing Arts' first play of the season.

In Chicago during the early '60s, he was lead singer for the "Young Savages." He says, "What we lacked in talent we made up for with our looks: pierced ears and huge afros." He also worked as the disc jockey "Daddy Trips" on radio station WEAW FM. Darryl's

resonating deep voice facilitated his performing voiceovers and narrations for such organizations as The Learning Channel and Cal/OSHA. He also worked for Art Simon Productions, doing voiceovers for numerous TV/radio commercial spots, and was a featured actor for "Sucky Productions," no reflection of his talents.

When you see Darryl, and believe me you will, walk up, shake his hand, and ask, "So, what do you know about music?" Be ready to listen for a fascinating long time. But don't try to trick him — you'll lose.


Our meeting will be on the third Wednesday of the month, and we
