From the General Manager

At the Board meeting at the end of July, the Board approved a remodel and expansion of the kitchen facilities at the Shadows Restaurant. The goal of this project is to expand the capability of the kitchen at the Shadows Restaurant to be able to cater events at the Montecito and the new Santa Rosa Clubhouses. With this expansion comes the ability to greatly improve the quality of what we are able to offer our residents not only at the restaurant itself but in our other venues. Staff has begun planning and is excited about the food related events that we will be able to offer you in the future.

As always when there are changes and significant investments made to accomplish those changes, there are questions that arise. Some of the questions that I have received since the board approval of this project are addressed below.

- *Is the board spending our reserve money to accomplish this project?* No, reserve funds are not being spent for this project. Reserve funds are for the repair and replacement of existing common area components. This remodel is an addition to the current components of the Shadows Restaurant.
- *How much money is the board spending on this project?* The cost of the project is approximately \$230,000. It is being funded from prior years' excess funds and will not impact our current or future year budgets.
- *Isn't this expansion just going to benefit the golfing community?* Absolutely not. This investment in our association is for ALL of our residents. By expanding our only true kitchen facility to be able to prepare food to cater to the Montecito and the Santa Rosa we will have the capability to serve more of our owners in our beautiful clubhouses and outdoor event lawn. You will now be able to have your events at Montecito or the Santa Rosa event lawn and not have to go outside for caterers and event planners.

- *When will the construction on the project begin?* The work on this project has already begun. The builder is currently getting the permits from the health department and the city. Once all permits have been received they will begin the actual construction. The anticipated completion date for the project is November 15.

- *Will the restaurant remain open during construction?* The restaurant will be closed for a few weeks so that the interior construction can be done without interfering with service in the restaurant. Our goal is to keep the closure to the shortest timeframe possible. Once I have the exact dates of closure, they will be posted on the website and on Channel 98.

Once we are open with our new expanded kitchen, staff is looking forward to helping you plan your next party or event to be catered by Shadows Catering. We know that you will be as pleased as we are to have all of our facilities able to receive quality catering at reasonable pricing.

Be sure to watch for all the exciting events that are being planned for our fall and our winter season. Stop by Lifestyle and ask our staff what all will be going on so you can plan to participate. Also, if you have a party that has not already been booked with an outside caterer and you would like to have it catered by Shadows Catering please let us know so we can work with you to make your event special.

If you have any questions please feel free to contact the Association staff. We will be glad to help you or direct your questions to the proper staff member so that your questions are answered in a timely manner. The Association office staff is looking forward to assisting you.

Trimming Trees and Bushes

Trees and bushes have really been growing because of the summer heat. You probably just trimmed your plants but, since they grow the most now, it's time to shape them up again. Because of safety, check that your tree branches are at least seven feet above public sidewalks and 12 feet above the street. If you have a street sign on your property, be sure that it is not hidden by branches so that drivers can easily see the street names. Bushes in your front yard should be no taller than 42 inches. A bougainvillea bush can grow 12 inches in 10 to 14 days this time of year, so you need to trim it more often to keep it under control.

Do not trim more than 20% of the foliage at any time! This morning, I saw a newly trimmed tree that consisted of a trunk, many branches and very little foliage. Good luck, tree! You have just removed the tree's source of food when it needs it most. It will have to start using the emergency supply of starches that is stored in the tree's roots. Hopefully, enough foliage will grow back quickly enough that the tree will be able to provide sufficient food before the emergency supply runs out. If the tree makes it, it will still have gone through a lot of stress that it didn't have to. For a more thorough guide to tree trimming, see the June *View* "Design Review" article.

Emergency Preparedness

Residents Complete CERT Training

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training concept was developed and implemented by the Los Angeles Fire Department in 1985. Since then thousands of people in 28 states and Puerto Rico have taken the training program that LAFD initiated. Understanding the responsibility in preparing for disaster, this program provides valuable information and training that increases the participant's ability to safely help themselves, their family, and their neighbors. There is no cost to the attendees; this is paid for by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which recognizes the benefits of having a volunteer force available in the event of a major catastrophe.

The CERT course benefits all citizens who take it, making them better prepared to respond to and cope with the aftermath of a disaster. Additionally, if a community wants to supplement its response capability after a disaster, civilians can be recruited and trained as teams that, in essence, will be auxiliary responders.

Following a major disaster, first responders who provide fire and medical services will not be able to meet the demand for their services. Recognizing the need to train citizens to be an extension of first responders by offering immediate help to victims until professional services arrive, the City of Indio launched its first Certified Emergency Response Training (CERT) course on July 27. The instructor was Philip Gairson, the new

Emergency Services Coordinator for the City of Indio Fire Services.

Bob Fredeen, Tony Davis, and Judie Davis of Sun City Shadow Hills completed the City of Indio's first 20-hour course held at the Indio Senior Center. The course included fire safety, disaster medical operations, conducting search and rescue, and handling hazardous and terrorist incidents. They each had to put out a fire using a fire extinguisher and proper fire safety procedures. Bob, Tony, and Judie are now certified as Community Emergency Response Team members, and can serve their communities when they aren't activated for emergency situations.

Philip Gairson will be conducting another 20-hour course in October. All Zone Leaders and Street Leaders, as well as other SCSH residents, are urged to take the free CERT course. It is one more important step in becoming prepared for an emergency. If you are interested in enrolling in this course, please contact Mr. Gairson at 760-775-9521 and join scores of others in SCSH who have become certified CERT volunteers.

Bill Baumann's Second Life as an Artist

Bill Baumann's life as an artist began at age 60. That's when he retired from Rockwell International, where he had worked in the design and manufacture of airplanes. "I had focused my life on airplanes. I felt narrow," Bill said. He began taking Humanities classes at UC Northridge, ending up with a BA degree. One of his areas of concentration was Visual Arts. As Bill recalls, "That's when I discovered a talent. I thought, 'Here's something I could do for the rest of my life.' So I went back to school and got a BA in art two years later."

While viewing the fall foliage in New England a year later, he and his wife visited the bridge at Concord.

Bill remembers, "I felt like I was on holy ground because the shot fired there led to the Revolutionary War, which led to our freedom."

Bill returned home and painted that scene, called *The Shot Heard Round the World*. As he was painting, Bill realized there were a number of dramatic scenes in American history that would make good paintings. "That's what got my passion," he said.

Thus began a sequence of 2' x 3' oil paintings that depicted defining moments in US history, beginning with Columbus and ending with the Twin Towers. Copies of the paintings would eventually be put in a book Bill created titled *Dramatic Moments*

in American History. Opposite each picture was a one-page discussion of the event, written by Bill based on his extensive research including traveling to the actual site being depicted, taking pictures, and talking to docents.

The next project for Bill was the *Passion and Exaltation of Jesus*. Bill wanted to depict the 14 Stations of the Cross as if they were photos taken at the time. His research discovered that not all the Stations were referenced in the Bible, so Bill painted 18 "Stations," starting with the Garden of Gethsemane and ending with His Ascension.

His third series of paintings, collected in a book titled *From The*

Beginning To?, was an attempt to merge Bible stories with scientific discoveries. As Bill explains it, "Rather than have scientists on one side and religious people on another, this book tried to merge the two together while dealing with the problems the world is facing today." The book of 27 paintings starts with the *Creation of the Cosmos*. The next section portrays key scenes from the history of all the major religions. The final section, *The Preservation of Freedom*, includes paintings about our World Wars and the challenges to freedom.

Paintings from the *Dramatic Moments* series were displayed at the Richard Nixon Library for three and a half months. The series was also exhibited at the Palm Desert Civic Center for three months. At the Palm Springs Desert Museum, Bill's paintings were chosen for a show in which only 37 artists were selected from among 1200 entries. His works have also been on display at the La Quinta Hotel and have been shown on TV.

Bill, now 88, and married to his second wife, Barbara, continues to paint, primarily family portraits. He is a member of the SCSH Creative Arts Club. "People there use oils, acrylics, watercolors, and all kinds of media. It's a fun group. And they put on shows here so you get to see your paintings displayed."

Bill has followed his passion for art since retiring. But it might never have happened. As he tells it, "Early on, when I was taking classes, one of my instructors said, 'Bill, you'll never be a success as an artist because you're not bizarre enough. You're just middle-of-the-road America.' I said, 'You just defined my strength. I'm middle-of-the-road America and that's what I'm going to paint.'"

Women's Lib and Me

I've been a feminist since second grade. Our parochial elementary school, St. Brigid's, boasted two playgrounds – one for boys and one for girls, the boys' play area being about six times the size of the girls'. Not fair! The reasoning was that the boys had more energy, more steam to blow off, and their games required more space; but I didn't buy it then or now. Hopscotch, volleyball, and dodge ball took up space as well. My ire had been piqued.

Somewhere around age 11 or 12, mom initiated the conversation regarding the facts of life, which included the social graces as they related to boys: be cheerful and friendly, and nice girls never phoned boys or in any way pursued them. That was their job. I was grateful for the information as my natural tendency would have been to go directly for the prize, which clearly would have been social suicide!

St. Mary's Academy, where I attended high school from 1957 to 1961, was an all-girls Catholic high school run by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet. We were taught to take ourselves seriously and to value our intelligence, the idea being that the sexual arena was a relatively minor part of our lives and would take care of itself. Our teachers, living communally and running schools and hospitals, I now see were living models of feminism.

I know I flirted with the idea of joining them, but in the end most of us opted for a life that would include husbands and children.

But there were lots of ideas vying for our consideration. Remember "fascinating womanhood?" *Seventeen Magazine* regularly advised that the path to a boy's heart was to become a really good listener. *Voila*, it worked! I'd listen and question and indeed the guy would talk and talk, and it was all about him. We'd date, and naturally the relationship became all about him, not him and me. Not fascinating...

Shortly after my age-19 marriage to Joe Haffley in late 1962, I was infuriated when I happened upon a book called *The Power of Sexual Surrender* by Marie Robinson, MD. The message was that "real women" surrendered their psyches and selves to the superior male and therein was the basis for true happiness and vaginal orgasms. I credit this book with supplying enough angst to fuel my personal revolution.

By the late 60s we had become the parents of three daughters. How could I think that these brilliant, smart little girls were inferior to the little boys of my friends? My husband's family hinted that in not producing a male we were lacking somehow; and although I didn't buy it, I didn't like it.

The social turmoil of the late 60s

ripened society for feminism and the idea that women were – gasp – equal to men. *Redbook*, *Ladies Home Journal*, even *Good Housekeeping* filled their pages with this emerging phenomenon. I watched Gloria Steinem on TV as she explained with grace and beauty how females had been objectified, exploited, and how the utopia of feminism would be a world in which men and women were equal partners. All this fell on my ready ears.

I enrolled in college, majored in Sociology, and in 1971 produced my first major term paper entitled *Discriminatory Social Conditioning → Loss of Human Resources*. What an exciting period! I was attracted to and befriended women with raised consciousness, and our optimism was palpable. Finally! The anger I had experienced over gender injustice was being addressed! *I Am Woman! Hear Me Roar!*

Ms. Magazine started publication in 1972, and later that same year we decided to terminate our marriage. Divorce is never easy, but Joe and I parted amicably, determined that we would both be parents to our daughters and remain friends with each other. Our daughters today say that we are the best divorced parents they know, so I guess we more or less succeeded. In hindsight I can see that the feminist ideas of independence and of discovering

parts of ourselves unconnected to marriage and motherhood resonated strongly in me and played a part in the decision to end our marriage. I went on to fulfill my dreams of independence and self-sufficiency before eventually remarrying.

My three daughters were raised in an environment which encourages females to make the most of their talents and abilities and to pursue their dreams. Each of them is in her own

way a present-day feminist, and each has also been faithful to those talents and dreams and is successful in her own right. For myself, I find it interesting that what we once considered revolutionary in 1972 is now commonplace (as seen on *Oprah* almost daily), and that yes, our revolution largely succeeded in changing hearts and minds. Not utopia, but I am heartened by our progress.



“The Art of Racing in the Rain”



The Art of Racing in the Rain has everything: humor, love, and despair. It is narrated by an amazingly intuitive dog named Enzo. The story opens with Enzo lying on his deathbed reliving his life with the wonderful family he dearly loves. His master, Denny Swift, is an aspiring race car driver from Seattle who is also a young husband and father. Enzo recalls all the highs and lows of his life with Denny – the tragic loss of Denny’s wife, Eve, and the ensuing custody battle with Eve’s parents over their daughter, Zoe. Denny discusses everything with Enzo, who listens intently as only a dog can, wishing with all his might that he had a real tongue instead of one that lolls uselessly in his mouth so that he could console his beloved master through the worst of times. Enzo dreams of Denny’s becoming a champion race car driver. After all, his Denny knows the techniques involved in racing in the rain — the tires, the speed, the negotiation of tricky curves.

This story will tug at your heart, and you will feel the infinite love a dog has for his master. Enzo’s voice will bring you insight into the joys and heartaches of your own everyday life. *National Geographic* is Enzo’s favorite television program, and it is here he garners much wisdom and where he learns how dogs are revered in Mongolia. “If you have ever been to Mongolia, you will know that dogs are highly regarded animals. When a dog dies, he is buried high in the hills so people cannot walk on his grave. The master whispers into the dog’s ear his wishes that the dog will return as a man in his next life. Then his tail is severed and placed beneath his head, and a piece of meat or fat is placed in his mouth to sustain his soul on its journey; before he is reincarnated, the dog’s soul is freed to travel the land, to race the high desert plains. Not all

dogs return as men, only those who are ready.” (*New York Times* review of *The Art of Racing in the Rain*)

The surprise ending will leave you looking into your dog’s soulful eyes and wondering, “Is it really possible they understand everything we’re feeling?”





Our Phase III Grand Opening Plans

I have wonderful news for everyone at Sun City Shadow Hills. We are planning the public Grand Opening of the new Santa Rosa Clubhouse and 10 new model homes for this coming November. This will be a particularly exciting event, because as I said we're planning to unveil both the new clubhouse for Phase III *and* our new "Living Well" collection of model homes.

The new "Living Well" collection has been designed with a very unique perspective. But I'll tell you about that next month. This month I want to focus on the major new amenity for the entire community, the Santa Rosa Clubhouse.

What will the new clubhouse be like? As you may know, especially if you attended one of our "hard hat" tours recently, the clubhouse will be sited on 6.2 acres with "desert lush" landscaping congruent with current community open space landscaping. As to the amenities included, we've tried to provide both some things that are new to the community, and some things that add to our most popular existing facilities.

The parking lot will have a golf drop off area, and there will be cart storage with shade covers for 40 carts. And a cart staging area. That's outside. Inside there will be a Golf Starter area with intimate seating and TV, and a Golf Bistro to serve hot dogs, sandwiches, drinks, and other light refreshments.

Inside the clubhouse there will be an entry lobby and reception desk. There will also be a conference/meeting room and a large multi-purpose room that can be separated into computer room, arts room, or movement room for yoga and many other activities.

Plus, something totally new; a new fitness center with a perimeter indoor walking track. Which we think residents will really enjoy, especially at certain times of the year.

And, naturally, the clubhouse will have Wi-fi access for everyone with laptops or tablets.

We're very excited about the new clubhouse. At 15,700 square feet under roof (14,136 square feet enclosed), it won't be as large as the Montecito, but it was never planned to be since it's meant to supplement our existing facilities. But it will make a very nice addition to the lifestyle offering at the community with, as I said, both new features and expansions of some features we already have.

In addition, we believe it will add real value to the community at a time when most new home communities have either been abandoned by their builders or are really struggling. Not here. Sun City Shadow Hills continues to be one of the best-selling new communities in all of California.



Speaking of ceramics, did you know that the oldest known body of pottery dates back 10,000 years, to the Neolithic revolution? Early pots were built by stacking rings of clay, which were then smoothed out and fired in a hole in the ground, under a bonfire. These pots were undecorated and expendable – they were created simply as a means to transport liquids, and sometimes were only used once and then disposed of.

Our club members have the opportunity to pour liquid clay into molds and, when the clay has somewhat “dried,” the mold parts are removed to reveal the clay object, now in a form called green ware. Sometimes our members prefer to buy the clay object already in the green ware stage, and some prefer to buy the clay object already fired in the kiln once, ready to paint. Whatever is your preference, why not come join us and try your hand at this fun art form?




Mah Jongg



Insurance Damage Claims

With our development in close proximity to the San Andreas Fault, retirees should have some knowledge of insurance damage claims.

Insurance companies look at damage claims as either an area to increase profits or provide superior service to gain loyalty. It may be worthwhile paying a little more for a company that makes it as easy as possible.

Independent agents represent several insurers serving the area and are aware which companies are known for hassle-free claims. If they are unhappy with a company, they usually steer their clients elsewhere. It may be helpful to contact the CA Department of Insurance (insurance.ca.gov) for a list of complaint ratios or enforcement actions against an insurer, or if you have a problem with a claim.

The next time you renew or purchase a homeowners or liability policy, be sure you know the coverage and exclusions. Ask your agent to answer any questions in writing. Your possessions should be inventoried. Go through the home with a video camera, open drawers, closets, cabinets, and

describe the items and how much they cost. Keep receipts for major items or anything else that can support a claim.

Report a claim quickly; don't fix or clean the damage until you have contacted your agent. Be aware of claim deadlines. In many states you can't sue an insurance company more than one year after a claim is filed.

If the company's claim estimate is too low, you can hire your own contractor or adjuster. Avoid signing any releases until completely satisfied.
