

Coachella Valley Water District has started the construction of its flood control project in North Indio. The purpose of the project is to protect homes and land in the area from regional flooding.

Starting on Monday, February 14, 2022, CVWD's contractor Sukut Construction will begin work inside Sun City Shadow Hills (SCSH).

Here is a list of work Sukut Construction will complete within the next three weeks:

- Prepare the area around Sun City Shadow Hills' Pond #1 for draining and excavation.
 - This is being done to install concrete lining on both sides of the pond to protect adjacent homes and serve as a flow outlet.
 - Complete construction of the downstream portion of the project to connect existing stormwater channels within Sun City Shadow Hills to existing channels in Sun City Palm Desert as construction progresses.
 - CVWD will engage a biologist about wildlife protection/relocation from the ponds to be removed to Pond #3.
- Install temporary fencing around the construction area.
- Install lockable access gate off Jefferson Avenue or Avenue 40 for workers, construction vehicles and equipment.
 - Sukut Construction will lock and secure access gate at the end of each workday.

In addition, the contractor plans to provide dust control for the construction site.

Work hours: 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. This schedule can change due to weather, season, and/or activity (such as concrete pouring). The Sun City Shadow Hills HOA will notify residents about upcoming schedule changes.

Timeline: February 2022 through fall 2022.

CVWD also mailed the attached postcard to all North Indio residents including those who live in Sun City Shadow Hills.
