PRESIDENT'S REPORT

JOHN MACDONNELL | PRESIDENT

The Road from Budget Meetings to the 2023 HOA Assessment

In my July and August articles, I laid out how our HOA functions, including an overview of our financial operations. That now brings us to “budget season,” which happens every year starting in August with meetings open to all homeowners.

I strongly recommend, if you have the time, desire to be part of the process, or wish to comment on the process to your Board, that you attend all of the budget meetings. Or, if you would rather, you can watch the meetings from the comfort of your home as each video is posted.

What is the process? Spreadsheets are prepared for the Board to review, detailing each budgeted category and comparing this to what has already been spent and what will be spent by the end of the year. The Financial Advisory Committee reviews the data ahead of time for accuracy and reasonableness.

The Board uses this historical data as the starting point for the 2023 budget. Evaluating the new budget begins with looking at the 2022 proposed budget and comparing the year-to-date actual money spent in each category.

This will show us how realistic our estimates were for 2022. Then, we go line item by line item and evaluate all the factors affecting the future budget. We rely heavily on data that has been gathered for us by the Advisory Committee Chairs, Desert Resort Management (DRM), Troon, and others.

It is only natural that there will be differing opinions about how the Board should spend the HOA's assessment dollars. Because the outcome of the total dollars budgeted determines the 2023 HOA

assessment (your monthly dues), the budget is not final until the Board votes on it in an open session in October. Up until the Board votes, all homeowners are encouraged to submit questions and suggestions to the Board. After all, this is your money.

This year, homeowners are already experiencing many cost increases in all aspects of your personal daily lives. During the budget process, your Board will have to deal with many similar issues on a much larger scale that reflect our common community expenses that we all share. The Board already knows that HOA insurance has dramatically increased in the second half of 2022.

Another example is the big increase in the cost of grass seed, included in Troon's part of our budget. In 2021, the cost was \$1.96/lb. In 2022 we paid almost \$2.75/lb. And in 2023 we expect to pay around \$3.00/lb. We use about 60,000 pounds of seed each year.

These are non-negotiable expenses. We must have insurance, and we have shopped for the best economically available policies at this time. All insurance rates are increasing exponentially. And it goes without saying that we must buy grass seed to protect our golf course and to safeguard SCSH home values.

I want to be upfront with you, as I have been in all my interaction with you, going into this budget

season. I am committed to the hard work of scrutinizing every item in the budget. Last year we were fortunate to keep the assessment increase low, but that is not likely to be the case this year. I am asking that everyone, please, remember this when presenting any "wish list" to the Board at the upcoming sessions. Every \$40K that we add to the budget in new spending adds \$1 to each homeowner's HOA assessment.

The Board will be weighing all options during the budget process and doing its very best during this difficult economic period for every homeowner.





Golf Course Residents: It is Time to Maintain Your Knee Walls

On a recent inspection, it became clear that during COVID-19 the routine repairs on knee walls have not been conducted.

There were various issues noted: some need to have stucco repaired, and some have been repainted with an unapproved color. According to the Design Rules, only two colors are permitted depending on what phase you live in. As a friendly reminder, the maintenance of knee walls is the responsibility of each homeowner. In this case, a Home Improvement Application is not required because this is considered routine maintenance.

At this time, we are asking all homeowners residing on the golf course to look at their knee walls and take the necessary corrective action to repair them.

The paint color codes are listed below. Please ensure that the paint finish is exterior flat.

For any questions, please contact the HOA office at 760-345-4349.

Here is the pertinent information on this issue from both the Design Rules and the CC&Rs.

Design Rules:

4.29.4 Fences (lots adjacent to the golf courses or open spaces, typically lots with knee walls): "...Any walls originally constructed by the declarant and located adjacent to the golf course or open spaces shall be maintained by the owner. The owner shall be responsible for maintaining the knee wall in a clean and attractive appearance that is substantially the same as the wall's original appearance. The paint color name and ID for knee walls for phase one is Navajo White DEC772. Phases two & three are Sandal DEC715 which can be purchased at Dunn Edwards..."

CC&Rs:

7.2 Owner Maintenance Responsibility

"...(f)It shall be the responsibility of the Owners of such lots to maintain, repair and replace such knee walls..."

Question of the Month: How is the Association Budget for 2023 created?

It would be an understatement, if I said it was anything but a complex process, but I think that you should be pleased that a great deal of time and effort goes into creating each yearly Association Budget. It starts with the General Manager meeting with each department head and reviewing the past year's budget and how the department succeeded or failed in meeting that budget and then the discussion turns to the coming year. Questions like what are your department's needs in 2023 and then the obvious inquiry: "is that something that is really needed in the coming year?" After those series of meetings and discussions, a draft budget is prepared and then the real work begins. It is said that every \$40,000 increase in the budget raises your monthly assessment by \$1, or \$12 a year. Now you see why this process is complex and really calls for complete and accurate reviews with a little prayer thrown in for good measure.

The draft budget is sent to each department for further review, and it is presented to the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC). The FAC, by Charter, is assigned the responsibility to assist the Board in the review, evaluation, and preparation of the budget(s). I say budget(s) as we are not discussing just one budget but a budget for the Association's Annual

Operating Fund and a Replacement Fund budget, as well. The FAC is also to work with all the other Advisory Committees who have requested budget allocations and it must carefully review each such request for its level of need and necessity and report to and make recommendations to the Board.

Once a draft budget has been created and reviewed and revised extensively, it is time to open it up to public inspection and review by our residents. There are three public meetings held each year in which the budget is displayed for the residents and comments are taken for further review. This year those meetings are at 10 am on August 24, September 21, and October 19 in the Montecito Ballroom. This will not be a normal year in which to create a budget because the US economy is experiencing inflation in the area of 8 to 12% and the investments of the Association funds have been affected as well by a weak financial market. *Please* join the FAC members and attend the public meetings and help the Association create our budget for 2023.

VoIP – What You Should Know

This article is targeting those of you who now use or are thinking about Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) telephones in your homes. You may have purchased a “bundled” service package with your cable or Internet service provider (ISP) such as Spectrum, Frontier, AT&T, etc, which includes VoIP telephone service.



When neighborhood electricity is not available (power failures, accidents, system failures, etc.), you need to know that, without a backup power source (battery, generator, etc.), your VoIP telephone service will not work, and this includes 911 service. Frontier issued a statement recently stating that, in the event of a power outage, you may not be able to make calls. You would need a functioning battery backup for either a Residential Gateway (RG = Router), or an

Optical Network Terminal (ONT) for fiberoptic networks, or have an alternate means of calling 911. This is true of all VoIP telephone systems. If your Internet is down because there is no electricity feeding your household modem, router, and computer; so is your VoIP telephone system.

Here are two emergency alternatives you may wish to consider:

1. You can use an old-fashioned analog hardline (can you say, “Princess Phone?”), pushbutton or rotary dial telephone as an alternative. But this requires a separate hardline from a telephone company. These “hardlines” carry their own electricity.
2. You could also consider a cellphone that relies on its battery and the cellular telephone system to provide an alternate means of calling.

Security is a major concern with VoIP, as it is with other Internet technologies. The most prominent security issues over VoIP are identity and service theft, viruses and malware, denial of service, spamming, call tampering, and phishing attacks. If you fail to keep a “clean” computer system (gateway), you could experience these problems.

Please be a good neighbor and do your part to contribute to community safety!

Javier Baltazar, Troon Gardener



Pedro Morales Ortega, Troon Mechanic




Nicolas Meraz Silvas, Troon Irrigation Technician

INDIO NORTH CHANNEL FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT

As residents of Sun City Shadow Hills know full well, the Coachella Valley is an arid desert region averaging less than three inches of rain per year. However, the surrounding mountains are subject to much higher rainfall rates which can produce unpredictable, damaging, and even deadly flash flooding events throughout the Coachella Valley. To mitigate the damage from these flooding events, the Coachella Valley Stormwater District was formed in 1915 to control regional flooding.

Fast forward to 2022, and you see the massive construction project underway, estimated to cost the Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) \$110,000,000. CVWD is responsible for overseeing the project and awarded the construction contract to Sukut Construction. The overall plan is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2024, while the construction affecting SCSH is currently projected to be completed in early 2023.

If you exit the front gate, turn right on Jefferson and, at the traffic signal, turn left onto Avenue 40, look to your right and you will see the construction of the flood control channels that will connect to the main channel that will go under Avenue 40, then under Jefferson and into the SCSH flood control area.

In the overall plan, some 2,700 acres in North Indio will be protected from flood waters, thereby removing that area from the FEMA-designated flood plain and eliminating the need for residents to purchase flood insurance. The drainage area that will be served by the project includes the Twentynine Palms and the Pushwalla flood plains (alluvial fans).

During a flood, runoff will flow into SCSH's north corner, where concrete walls have already been constructed.

(Eventually, they will be covered with soil, landscaped, and a lake will be constructed there.)

From there the flood water will flow under the entrance to SCSH, across Camino San Mateo to South Course golf holes #12, #13, and #14, then cross Camino Santa Juliana, and on to hole #15, where it will enter a diversion channel that will run under I-10 and into the big Coachella Valley Stormwater Channel.

The Board of Directors has created an eight-member ad hoc committee, chaired by Chris Stevens, to monitor this project. They will keep the Board and the homeowners informed about its status and assess the future impacts of stormwater flows into our property.








Bunco

Quilting produces a lot of cotton fabric and batting scraps. Our club turns these scraps into dog and cat beds. After cutting scraps of fabric and batting into smaller scraps, they are stuffed into shells that we sew from donated fabric, usually lightweight upholstery fabric. Lisa Roberts from the Pet Club picks up our beds and delivers them to no-kill shelters in the Coachella Valley, or in some cases to shelters in Moreno Valley. Since the beds go with the pet when it is adopted, there is an ongoing need for these beds and the shelters are very grateful for them. Our club produces 250 to 350 beds a year.
