PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings to all my fellow community members. Each month that I am on this Board brings both joy and challenge. I know there are some who wonder why anyone would volunteer to be on the Board of Directors. As a member of the Board, I have been fortunate enough to witness the dedication and hard work of our volunteers. So many of you have made the decision to give back to our community and, without your efforts, our neighborhood would not be the welcoming, and tplace it is today. I want to take a moment to express my gratitude for your participation.

Now for the challenges. As you know, Pulte is going to build 1,500 homes immediately next door to us, and it does pose certain potential challenges for our community. The CDCC committee is tasked with interfacing with the City of Indio to make sure that our interests are heard before decisions are made.

As I write this, Pulte and our City Council member (Glenn Miller) have given me absolute assurance that the proposed sewer line will not be upsized through our Sun City Shadow Hills community. The assurance is not written in stone, so we will continue to focus on keeping this from happening.

As another level of protection, the Board has engaged the services of a local law firm to ensure that our rights are protected involving the Environmental Impact Report and all aspects of this new development. This law firm has defended other communities facing Pulte developments.

The next difficult challenge the Board faces is when distinct groups within our community have different views on how our amenities should be used. For instance, the Pickleball and Tennis Clubs have differing opinions about how our amenities should be allocated. Trying to find the right answer is never easy, and this Board will continue to seek solutions that are a win-win for the community. I want to thank Pickleball and Tennis for their input, which has helped the Board with the decision-making process. The other party to this decision is, of course, the community. Your contribution will be decisive, so your input will be a large part of the answer. We will be soliciting your thoughts and desires concerning this issue soon.

By now you should be able to enjoy lite bites and drinks at the Montecito Café. The Board, Lifestyle, Food & Beverage, and Troon worked very hard to open the Montecito Café this summer. The concept was to stop putting off what we hope will be a successful return to rebuilding this amenity and expand that success in the fall. Please be sure to visit and see what Chef has prepared. Although I was initially involved with this project, I especially want to thank Scott Pessin, Board Vice President, for leading the way in this endeavor to give back to our community.

Finally, I want to thank all our vendors who make living here in Sun City a pleasure. Whether it is the security team, landscaping team, facilities team, or HOA team, please give a wave or say hi to those folks who are putting in the work during this sizzling summer to make our lives just a little bit better.



The Importance of Setbacks

During the fall and winter months, the DRC receives an increasing volume of Home Improvement Applications (HIAs). Most require clear information about setbacks, and when applications are received without that information, the request must be denied, resulting in a delay for the homeowner.

A "setback" is the distance from the property line walls and the minimum distance where the desired object will be installed. You can find information regarding required setbacks in Exhibit A of the Design Rules (DR): www.scshca.com/designrules. This exhibit applies to many different additions or modifications such as pools, spas, fountains, and BBQs.

It is always a good idea to review the setback requirements when your project is in the early planning stages. A great example is a pool installation. Consideration must be given to, not only the setback requirements for the pool, but also that the proposed location of the pool equipment (pumps, heaters, etc.). Placement must not violate the setback requirements for Ground Mounted Equipment, which must be located three (3) feet from the property line wall.

Multiple Projects? Consider Multiple HIAs

When doing multiple projects, it is often a great idea to submit a separate HIA for each. I just heard a collective groan: one HIA is work, but now the DRC wants us to submit several? Ridiculous! Or is it? Let me explain. You want to do multiple projects and submit one HIA with a new pool, decking, backyard landscaping, removing lawn in front yard, adding artificial turf, taking out existing trees, adding new trees and plants, and adding new lights and a fountain. If there is a setback missing, or some other item was omitted, the entire application must be denied pending resubmittal of the missing item(s). But if each element (front yard, back yard, or pool) is submitted on a separate HIA, the DRC will approve each element that it can. Separate HIAs are not required, but many homeowners have found it helpful.

The DRC is here to work with you. We invite you to contact us ahead of time, ask questions, and request information. Our job as volunteer homeowners is to approve your applications per the Design Rules.

Finance Advisory Committee (FAC)

Question of the Month: When does our Association start to plan the budget for 2024?

The answer is August 2023. We start in August because this is a complex process to plan financially for the operation of a community the size of Sun City Shadow Hills. The Association, its Board and its many volunteers must consider the daily needs of 3,450 homes, the residents, and all the infrastructure that allows this community to function efficiently on a daily basis for 365 days.

The process starts with the General Manager meeting with each department director reviewing with them the 2023 budget, if it has met their needs, and then what the needs will be in 2024. As the community infrastructure ages, there will be more and more replacement and repair issues and workers required to meet those needs during the year.

After these meetings, a draft budget is prepared and then begins the long process of review and adjustment in order to meet the community needs and still operate within a budget, that does not significantly increase the Association dues for the residents. The inflationary cycle that we have seen over the last 36 months, has constantly put pressure on the monetary requirements of the operating budget of the Association and unfortunately, we cannot predict when that cycle will end. We also do not want our community to decline in appearance, function, amenities, or residential values, so we spend the time necessary to try to satisfy all those needs. Once the draft budget is reviewed and receives preliminary approval by each Association department, the Finance Advisory Committee, and the Board, it is time to ask the residents to participate in the budget process by attending the public budget meetings and by adding their opinions and input to this draft budget.

This "public inspection and review" of the budget by our residents is extremely important! This is our community, and we need to contribute our time and attention to this process. We all desire a sound financial plan for 2024 and this is therefore *your call to participate* in the following public meetings:

- AUGUST 16, 2023 | 10 am in the front half of the Montecito ballroom
- SEPTEMBER 20, 2023 | 10 am in the front half of the Montecito ballroom
- OCTOBER 18, 2023 | 10 am in the front half of the Montecito ballroom

We look forward to your involvement in preparing the budget for 2024. Please do not fail to add your voice to the creation of the 2024 budget, as once the Board approves the budget in December it is your budget and we all will want to feel that we have done our utmost to create a sound financial plan for 2024.


From the Library

THE ADVENTURES OF MY AUSTRALIAN BEBOP LID

Practically all the jazz musicians I played music with wore interesting hats they called bebop lids. So I joined their club and have worn a variety of them over the years. One of my favorite lids was black wool, made in Australia by Kangol, and it displayed their kangaroo logo on the back. I wore it to my gigs; and one of my CDs, called *Journey*, displays a picture of me wearing it on the cover with Carmelo, my vibraphone. Wearing a bebop lid indicated to fellow musicians that you were a jazzer, with pride, dignity, and respect for the profession.

About 15 years ago a woman named Maria Rigoli, from Melbourne, Australia, sent me an e-mail telling me that she had purchased some of my jazz CDs. Maria said she was trying to figure out if we were related since our Rigoli families both came from Ucria, Sicily. After sending pictures of our families back and forth, we concluded that we were cousins.

Her family immigrated to Australia where she was raised on a farm. She had become a lawyer and had her own law firm. When she visited us with her partner, and I saw her for the first time, I realized that she looked just like my Aunt Sarina Rigoli. We had a great time and have kept in touch ever since. She brought me an Australian fisherman's lid from Italy that had a different design from my other Australian bebop lid. I cherished that lid from Italy, and then somehow it mysteriously got lost. I have a thing for my Australian lids.

A few weeks ago, I stopped at a McDonald's to have a shake. I was carrying my laptop computer in my carry bag plus I had my Australian bebop lid on. When I sat down at a table to drink my shake, I took off my lid and placed it on my computer carry bag next to me so I wouldn't forget it. When I finished drinking my shake, I picked up the carry bag and left. I had a doctor's appointment to get to and was in a hurry to get there. When I got home and pulled into the garage, I looked for my lid and couldn't find it.

I called McDonald's for several days, and no one had found it. The following week I stopped at the same McDonald's to inquire once again. Believe it or not, I saw a homeless man hanging around outside with what looked like my Australian bebop lid on his head. He was pretty funky and, looking more closely, I realized that really was my lid on his head. I looked at him in his worn-out clothes and he had a smile on his face. After studying him for a few minutes, I could tell that my bebop lid made him feel special.

A flash came to me. Could he be an old jazz musician gone astray who was maybe reminiscing about his past? I had the feeling that my old lid made him feel distinguished. 





CHEF'S CORNER

"Hot August Nights." Yes, we are in our dreaded summer run in the desert. Those of us who call the valley our home brave the summer while anxiously awaiting fall's arrival. This is a double-edged sword as we hate the summer but love the lack of crowds, and love the fall and winter but dread the crowds that swarm our world.

Summer brings some real challenges related to the heat, one of which is cooking. I hate to heat up the house using the oven, so I avoid it as much as possible. Because of that, I like to do most of my cooking outside on the grill, which avoids the extra demand on our air conditioner. I tend to cook almost everything on the grill: meats, vegetables, and even some desserts like grilled peaches, plums, and pineapple served with ice cream or sherbet.

Fish Filets Cooked in Foil on the Grill

- 6 to 8 oz. fish filets (your favorites)
 Foil
 ¼ cup lemon juice
 2 tablespoons butter, melted
 1 tablespoon dill
 ¼ tablespoon Old Bay Seasoning
 Lemon slices
 Dill leaves
 Thinly sliced onion
 Salt and pepper to taste
 Make sauce with butter, lemon juice, and dill.
- Lightly season fish with Old Bay Seasoning.
- Spray or butter sheet of foil.

One of the things I like to do is grill fish filets in foil. It is a great way to cook fish without a lot of prep or clean-up. Because you prepare the fish in foil, it cooks evenly and stays very tender without falling apart. You can use your favorite filets like salmon, sole, cod, trout, and tilapia. Simply place your fish on the foil, add your sauce and aromatics, seal your foil to create a pouch, then place it on the grill over indirect heat – and in 7 to 12 minutes you have dinner. I usually grill some vegetables to have with the fish and include a salad for a light dinner that's perfect for a "Hot August Night."

Old Letters in a Suitcase

When my mother passed, my younger brother inherited the task of cleaning out her town house and settling her estate. Sometime long after the funeral, Tom visited us and left an old suitcase that once belonged to our mother.

I eventually opened the suitcase to find a large bundle of letters, all neatly bound with a faded pink ribbon. Working my way through these letters, I determined that all were written by my Mother to my Dad during WWII. Watson was stationed overseas with the Canadian Army while my Mom spent the war working in a grocery store and raising my older brother and me.

In a small mining town, there was not much in the way of exciting news, so Betty writes about her two boys, their daily activities, fights, adventures, and achievements. I hastened to transcribe all these letters for the rest of our family, explaining the many references to friends, family, neighbors, and locations as best I could. I also included the war timeline.

No letters from Watson to Betty survived. But now, our family has the most amazing insights into our early wartime lives.




Meditation Over Medication


