PRESIDENT'S REPORT

JERRY CONRAD | PRESIDENT

Hello, neighbors. When I think of September, I usually think of my upcoming anniversary with my lovely wife or maybe the beginning of the end of the hot days of summer. When I became a Board member, another thought entered my mind: the annual budget review. As you read this, the Board, the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC), and SCSH staff are working hard on the 2024 Budget; and the countdown to vote on it begins. Here is a thumbnail sketch of what is about to happen and how it may affect each one of us.

The Board will meet with the FAC and review past and present expenses. In these meetings, we will decide the future expenditures within the 2024 budget. The FAC members are the real heroes in this discussion. They bring many years of experience and expertise that the Board relies on to make the ultimate decision about how much and where to spend your monthly dues. The Committee and Board will meet formally at least three times, and have many informal meetings, to go over the numbers and how they affect the dues.

Speaking of dues, I know the rise last year was a hefty one. This year I am hopeful that, with careful control of spending and the \$175,000 saved in insurance costs, we can limit the increase. There are no guarantees in this process. Costs are indeed going up, and there are several community "wish list" projects. I am not blind to the realization that Pulte's Desert Retreat community will be built, and that will influence our restaurant and golf course. I am sure this issue will be reviewed in detail during our discussions.

One of the largest increases last year was in our Reserve Fund. This fund is vital to the health of our community and we must maintain it at the highest possible reasonable level. It is approximately 70% funded right now, which is incredibly financially solid. The FAC will be making its recommendation to the

Board about what amount will be needed to continue this level of security.

Although our Association is on a very solid footing financially, I remind you that, in my first President's Report, I mentioned that my philosophy this upcoming year would be to "tighten our belts." My idea is to try to focus on those amenities we already have and make sure they are working to their best use.

When we discuss staffing, I believe that unless we seriously consider raising the income of our staff, we may not be able to attract new workers, and we will find it hard to retain the staff we have. To me, this is job one. That means, if dues go up, which seems more than likely, then let's put that increase where it will have the biggest impact.

I encourage each one of you to read the financial information published monthly in The View and attend the Board meetings and budget meetings, so you will understand where your valuable dollars are being spent. An informed community is a healthy community.

Meet Our Members and Find Out How They Serve You

Looking back on The View articles I have written since becoming Chair of the Design Review Committee (DRC) in December 2021, I have tried to focus on sections of the Design Rules to bring clarity and ease of understanding about what, why, and when homeowners need to take action.

One very important matter I have yet to do is introduce our five-member DRC. The DRC meets twice a month to review all Home Improvement Applications (HIAs) submitted regardless of the number of applications received.

As you can imagine, during the season the numbers run high, and some applications can be very extensive.

It is not a simple matter to review applications for swimming pools, casitas, and other constructionrelated items. Remember, the committee must review all aspects of the project including setbacks, property lines, water runoff, etc.

Our typical meetings run five hours, and special projects trigger additional meetings. Often, when an HIA is submitted with insufficient information but only minor elements are missing, we ask the homeowner to bring the additional information to the HOA office so the Committee can approve the application and not delay the applicant.

During the course of a calendar year, the DRC typically processes 700 HIAs. We believe in working for the homeowners!

In addition, for every HIA, the DRC inspects every project upon completion to ensure it was done following the approved plan. That means 700 inspections per year! The five-member committee completes these inspections with the help of a threemember sub-committee. A DRC member, with the original application and plans in hand, visits the property to check every element and, if completed to the original submission, signs off.

But your current committee members saw the need for more and better service. And here are some other ways they work for you:

- 1. For homeowners who are contemplating a project but are not sure what needs prior written approval, or what kind of plants to use, or have other questions, the DRC committee members are available to discuss these concerns.
- 2. The DRC monitors the committee's email address (designreview@scshca.com) and answers questions from homeowners. If the issue requires a meeting, the homeowner is then invited to attend a DRC meeting to discuss their concern or suggestion. Often, the DRC hears suggestions that prompt the DRC to propose a rule change.
- 3. The DRC can walk you through the HIA application process. Please do not hesitate to reach out to any of the five DRC members or to Celeste Cordero, (celeste.cordero@associa.us) Community Associate, Architectural.

All SCSH Advisory Committees have wonderful, dedicated volunteer members. I am especially proud to serve alongside the outstanding members of the DRC who spend many, many hours every month, often in the blazing sun, working for this community. The DRC has a cohesive team who have taken the time to learn the Design Rules and CC&Rs, understand how to read the plans submitted, and work with respect and professionalism as a great team. When you see them around the community, please stop and say, "Hello, and thank you."

Finance Advisory Committee (FAC)

Question of the Month: Does California have a set of laws that apply to our Association?

The answer is YES and it is called the Davis-Stirling Common Interest Development Act. You find it at California Civil Code Sec. 4000 et.seq. The Act applies to any form of real estate where each owner holds exclusive rights to a portion of the property, which in our association is your lot, and where there are shared rights in common areas. The Act calls us either "members or owners" in the statutory provisions and we are a part of a "planned development." The common areas are owned in our Association by the corporative entity that created and forms our Association i.e., the Sun City Shadow Hills Community Association, a California Mutual Benefit Corporation.

It is important to note that, even though the corporate entity has ownership rights; it is a common interest mutual benefit entity, in which all its members have shared rights and responsibilities for the common areas. Therefore, the Association's powers are limited to those to be normally exercised for the mutual benefit of its members.

But with a member's mutual benefit comes certain restrictions that "run with the land," which means that each owner that buys property in this association acquires their property subject to the recorded restrictions. These restrictions include the community plan as recorded and the CC&Rs. If you have ever wondered what CC&R stands for, those letters refer

to "Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions." In addition, the Davis-Stirling Act grants the association by law the right to create articles, by-laws, and rules which may not be recorded, but by California statute each owner is subject to those articles, by-laws, and rules that are lawfully enacted. All these noted restrictions and rules govern all the property in this association.

A property member/owner must also understand that the Davis-Stirling Act gives one specific rights under the law. The law provides that the statutes are to be liberally construed, which means that they are to be read broadly to accomplish the purpose for which they were written. Also, the Association's governing documents must not conflict with statutory law. California courts will generally uphold an association's governing CC&Rs and Rules, unless they are arbitrary or impose burdens on a few residents that substantially outweigh their benefits to other residents or violate fundamental public policy.

While the strength of the powers processed by the Association may seem overwhelming, there are many rights guaranteed to a property owner as well. Some of the many protected rights include: the right to display the American flag, the right to keep pets (although the number can be limited), the right to solar energy systems, the right to have satellite systems on

your home, and the right to display religious items, are just a few of the guaranteed rights you have in this Association by-law.

The Davis-Stirling Act also provides for the structure of the Association's governing Board, its obligations, and its limitations. The election process is also prescribed to assure fairness and accuracy. A member's right to appeal on issues like fines or unreasonable failures to grant property variances, etc. is protected. Plus, the Association's collection rights for unpaid assessments are carefully regulated by statute.

The statute also controls what reserve funds are necessary and restricts how they can be used. In addition, communications from the Association are

required annually to provide association financial reports, budgets, insurance coverage, reserve study reports, and other items that impact the peaceful enjoyment of your property ownership.

We live in a "Google world" now, so if you have a question about your Association's actions simply ask for the Davis-Stirling provision that can answer your concern or look at the Rules enacted by the Association.

We should all be very grateful that California has a law that protects our property rights and grants us, as owners, rights when dealing with the Association and its governing powers.

HISTORY OF THE AMERICAN ROAD TRIP A Product of War and Peace

In most of America, the dawn of summer spells the need to travel and, since Americans are in love with their cars, the road is a pathway to adventure. The American road trip can be defined in many ways. It's rarely about the specific destination but more about the route and what happens along the way. The joy of the road trip lies in its spontaneity and the unpredictable, which satisfies the hunger for a thrill or a new experience.

It's hard to believe that, a little over a century ago, most Americans considered the road trip not an adventure, but an expedition or even a possible survival situation. Prior to 1920, road conditions in much of the U.S. consisted of deep ruts, high centers, unbridged streams, sand, dust, or just plain mud.



Prior to 1920, road conditions were poor and unpredictable.

These early aspiring road trippers considered themselves modern gypsies. Those who made longdistance drives hauled ropes, blocks and tackle, axes, sleeping bags, water, stoves, first aid kits, all-weather apparel, and sufficient firearms to launch a small war. Some drivers envisioned themselves as hermit crabs staggering along the road carrying their house on top of their primitive cars.

Early innovators like Henry Ford and Thomas Edison observed these trends with interest and worked to perfect their skills. The infamous Model T made the personal automobile available to those who could afford it, and both Ford and Edison released an electric battery version that they both believed would dominate America's needs. But with the onset of World War I, the U.S. and its Allies were forced to unleash unproven technologies to ensure a victory.

At the turn of the 20th century, Texas oil wells flooded the market with hundreds of thousands of barrels of crude oil. This new, cheap product was deployed on the battlefield and proved its reliability by powering trucks, tanks, and any stationary equipment. Not only did this new product help win the war, but it was now poised to revolutionize American transportation. With public support from tax dollars, the push for a new infrastructure was born.

While Henry Ford continued to make the internal combustion engine more reliable and the Model T more affordable, entrepreneurs all over the country began to invest in businesses that sprang up along the more frequently traveled routes. Guidebooks produced by the newly formed American Automobile Association and the Automobile Club of America began advertising these businesses. Gasoline suppliers like Gulf Oil produced maps branded with their logo for free distribution by their service stations.


Dwight Eisenhower, then an Army Lieutenant Colonel, had a huge influence on America's evolving infrastructure. Just prior to 1920, Eisenhower undertook his own drive across the country to assess the country's capability to move large amounts of troops and equipment over long distances. It was a trip he would not soon forget.

Eisenhower's report to the Army cataloged a mix of paved and unpaved roads, old bridges, and narrow

thoroughfares. Vehicles were often run off the road by oncoming traffic. Some bridges were too low for trucks to pass under, and diversions took miles to reenter the primary roadway. Eisenhower's assessment concluded that a radically different infrastructure was needed and not merely an improvement of what was already in place.

When Eisenhower was deployed to Europe in the 1930s, he mapped the military value of French roads and admired the superb efficiency of the German Autobahn. By the end of World War II, Eisenhower had developed a rare global expertise in civil engineering and how it could be applied to the transportation infrastructure that the U.S. critically needed.

Early in his presidency, Eisenhower created the President's Advisory Committee on the National Highway System. A plan was formulated to spend \$50 million of federal funds over a 10-year period to build a vast system of interconnected highways. The country was growing, and its citizens needed and demanded to be mobile. The committee also warned that interconnected highways into and out of large cities were required for large-scale evacuations in the event of nuclear war. By the end of Eisenhower's second term, 46,000 miles of highways was available to Americans.



Of course, the new national infrastructure that developed in the 1950s depended on inexpensive fuel. Eisenhower's plan would never have succeeded without a ready supply of petroleum products that drove America's internal combustion engines.

Infrastructure developments and future plans were running on fuel that was so cheap and plentiful, that everyone assumed it would never run out.

But as history demonstrates, petroleum-based on fossil fuels was not the inevitable choice for the 20th century; it had to compete with other energy sources. The internal combustion engine won the competition thanks to the support of business and military interests. The choice was reinforced by the public, and this led to a marketplace and landscape of drive-thrus and filling stations.

Today there are 160,000 miles of highway available for road trippers along with gas and re-charging stations, rest stops, convenience stores, diners, hotels, and anything else needed to make the trip an uninterrupted and pleasurable experience. Most Americans will take to the road at some point in their lives, but each person will experience the road differently.

September and Labor Day signal the final days of summer and the gateway to fall and cooler weather. Coming from the Bay Area, it was the perfect time of year to enjoy a great BBQ or outdoor party before the weather cooled and the leaves turned. Marinated Beef Kabobs

Sirloin, tri-tip, flat iron, or even tenderloin, depending on your budget and desire

Red onion

Red bell pepper

Mushrooms, whole

Bamboo or metal skewers

Marinade:

¼ cup olive oil

- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 3 tablespoons soy sauce
- 3 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 1 teaspoon ginger
- Salt and pepper to taste

- Soak your skewers in water if wood or bamboo.
- Combine all ingredients in the marinade (save a small amount to coat skewers once they come off the grill).
- Cut up the beef in large cubes and place into a zip lock bag with marinade for at least 30 minutes.
- Cut onions and peppers to fit on the skewers.
- Assemble skewers alternating beef, onion, peppers, and mushrooms.
- Place on grill and brush marinade onto skewers periodically during cooking.
- Once cooked, take off grill and let rest for at least 5 minutes before serving.

Tip of the Month: It's in the Hands

If you are on the driving range this weekend, ask a few golfers about their least favorite area of the game to practice. The answer is almost always "the grip."

The golf grip is just a boring thing to practice. Whether you are new to golf or have been around a while, it's not nearly as exciting as trying a new takeaway or working on ball flight and distance. Try as hard as you can to use a neutral grip position. The natural position will ensure that your shots don't waver too much right or left, although at times you may need to alter the grip slightly to fix a certain type of shot. Pay very close attention to grip pressure. Too loose can cause instability at impact and too tight will end up restricting movement, resulting in loss of power. Give your grip the attention it needs and don't be afraid to alter it, if needed.

I've been playing golf nearly my entire life, and I still make adjustments to my grip from time to time.




