The existing police department and fire department is there but they they're building the new state of an art facility and that's where they're the city of Indio is going to build a memorial for the 911. Okay. And in addition to that, there is a flags program honoring individual veterans, correct? Tell us about that.

And so, when I heard about it, I was extremely, extremely thrilled to, in thankful to the city of Indio for doing that. The city of Coachella has started this a long, long time ago. And when I saw that, I brought it up to the council members, which back then it was Michael Wilson and Glenn Miller. I spoke with them. And they say that they that was extremely wonderful idea, Lo and behold, years down the road, the program



is flourishing, the program is going on. And this is to honor all of our veterans that have served, whether they have served or they're still active in all the armed forces. It's so nice, it is so wonderful. And it's such an amazing feeling to go down 111 to go down Towne street to go down Miles Avenue downtown, you know. And all you have to do is you just have to have your, your dismissal papers, and proof of that, okay. And then I'll photo of your when you were in the service and be a resident of the city of Indio. You file that it's free, everything is free. You file there with the city of Indio, and they will tell you, they will let you know within two to three weeks no later than two to three weeks. And they will let you know that your flag or your member or your. It will be honored in one other streets.

Once it goes up, it's there indefinitely. Is that true?

I know that they're expand that Indio is growing so they have plenty of room for you know, your family member's flag to be up indefinitely.

Oh, that's good. So then there is there a limit on how many people how many flags there's going to be or is it basically unlimited at this point?

I think it's unlimited at this point. I haven't heard any anything about having a limit. But I think up until right now it's unlimited.
