

- ∘ 10,908 quakes 1 Year



Important if you cannot communicate

Complete the Vial of Life form

Place form in baggie with sticker

Tape inside refrigerator door

Tape sticker on front door



In an Emergency... and Now!!!



Red/Green Cards

Laminated sheets

Green – I'm okay

Red – I need help

Display on front door, garage door, gate, etc.

Available in both clubhouses

EPC – Watch Patrol

Call for help if needed

OK

Instructions

- ace this side of the sign in a window that can be seen from the road/street
- You do not require immediate assistance from Emergency Services
- No one in the home has medical conditions which require urgent medical treatment
- You will not require assistance to evacuate (if an evacuation is ordered)
- You have sufficient food and water to last you 72 hour
- You have a means of staying warm
- You have a way to communicate with Emergency Service

HELP

Instructions

Place this side of the sign in a window that can be seen from the road/street.

- You need immediate assistance from Emergency Services
- . Someone in your home has a medical condition that requires urgent medical treatment
- You have mobility or transportation requirements that would make it difficult to evacuate (if an evacuation were ordered)
- You do not have suffice
- Too nate no way or snaping maxim

Widespread electrical outages

No Banks

No ATMs

No Cash registers

No gas stations

Need \$1s, \$5s, \$10s, & \$20s





Fire Extinguishers

Class ABC Fire Extinguishers

Use on most types of fires Minimum of two per home Accessible & fully charged

PASS Method

Pull – the Pin Aim – at bottom of fire Squeeze – the trigger Sweep – side to side

Must recharge after use!!!

Think About Glass!!!


Glass & porcelain hitting stone countertops or tile floors will...

Shatter!!!

Floors & people covered in shards of glass!
Secure mirrors, photos, vases & displays

Hazardous & Dangerous Chemicals

Paint, woodworking chemicals, weed & bug killers, etc.

Attach heavy objects



Prepare to Live - Water

Water 14+ Days

1 gallon per person per day

Additional water for...

Sick people

Animals

Hot weather

Hydrating dried food

Available in tank water heater

Prepare to Live - Food



Food for 14+ days



Option 1 – Pantry Food

Canned or dry meats

Dry cereal

Canned fruits/vegetables

High energy items



Option 2 – Freeze Dried Food

Good for up to 25 years

Somewhat expensive

Amortize cost


Is My Food Safe???

Refrigerator

Above 41 degrees > 4 hours
Perishables may not be safe

Freezer

Above 41 degrees > 1 or 2 days May not be safe See Ice crystals, probably okay!



Basic First Aid Kit

Bandages, compresses, pressure pads Sterile dressings & adhesive tape

Sterile water

Antiseptic, aspirin & pain medication

Scissors & tweezers

Latex gloves & hand sanitizer

First Aid Kit Additions


Medications – 2 Weeks

Health supplies - Insulin & syringes

Assistive devices – Glasses, canes, etc.

Official Red Cross 1st Aid Kit

- More extensive
- More expensive

Leather gloves

Flashlights & Batteries

UV Protection& Sunglasses

Matches, Whistle, & Manual can opener


Clothes, Shoes,

What's in Your Nightstand?

Necessary Items:

Hard-soled shoes

Heavy gloves

Crow or pry bar

Flashlights & batteries

Cell phone and charger

Secure everything over and around bed!

Generators!!!

Provide Electricity

Important for life-saving medical devices



Transportation








CARS AT LEAST HALF FULL

Shelter


Under sturdy furniture
Interior wall
Low-lying heavy furniture
Not in Doorway!!!

Cover head & neck!

Hold On!!!

Aftershocks may be more severe!!!

Until shaking stops



Shaking Stops Assess Personal Situation!

Assess

Condition of household

Injuries

Damage to interior

Assess

Condition of exterior

Check for gas leaks

Check for water leaks

Assess

Condition of yard perimeter

Second...

Open garage door
Manually, if necessary

Remove car(s) and cart
Keep garage door open

Display Red/Green card

Move disaster supplies to handy location

Assess neighbor's situation
Render aid if possible

Earthquake Tips

Do not call 911 unless true emergency

Life or death situation

Stay in home if structurally sound

Do not leave SCSH unless damage is severe

What About Our Community???

Time to Help Others...If able!

- Spontaneous volunteers not covered by HOA liability insurance
- Must be member of EPC or other SCSH committee
 CA Good Samaritan Law


